God's Armor: Truth, Righteousness, Gospel

Hold your ground, ready with truthfulness and faithfulness (14a)

Hold your ground, protected by righteous character (14b)

Hold your ground, sure-footed by the good news of peace (15)

Eph 6:14-15

Girding the loins

- Leather belt or girdle to protect the thighs
- Used for tucking in the long folds of their tunic to allow quicker and more steady movement in battle
- It indicates readiness to act

Loins girded with truth - Eph 6:14

Eve, with her belly full of fruit, questioned God's goodness for withholding one tree. Jesus, with his stomach empty from fasting, stood His ground against Satan's misuse of Scripture. Jesus defeated Satan with the truth of God's word used correctly.



Breastplate - Eph 6:14

- Greek "thorax"
- Person's chest or trunk
- Piece of armor which protects a person's trunk
- Single sheet of metal or a coat of mail
- Typically covered the chest area and the back
- Protected the vital organs

What righteousness is not - Eph 6:14

NOT the "legalistic behavior and accomplishments" that so many Christians clothe themselves with. Such a "cloak of self-righteousness gives Satan a ready-made weapon to stifle and smother our spiritual life and service"
