The Bible's Teaching About The Proud

- "God is opposed to the proud" (Jas 4:6; 1 Pet 5:5; Prov 3:34; Ps 138:6)
- "The LORD will tear down the house of the proud" (Prov 15:25)
- "Everyone who is proud in heart is an abomination to the LORD" (Prov 16:5)

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Woe 4 - Demeaning

He manipulates others so he can get his way (15-17)

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Woe 5 – Won't obey God

He trusts in anything but God (18-19)
