Heaven is a matter of faith

Faith is the assurance of Goal things hoped for (Heb 11:1; Phil 3:20) By faith we take hold of God's promises while we Grip suffer (Heb 11:10-16) Keeping heaven in view, Guard trials won't overwhelm us

Heaven puts our suffering in perspective

(2 Cor 4:17-18)

Ed Welch advises "searching Scripture for awesome pictures of God" like in Isa 6, Ezek 1, and Revelation




