- → "In/im" means "not".
- "Mutable" means it can change.
- God is not mutable, That is, He cannot change.

### New Testament Giving Principles

Regular

Corresponds to God's provision to you (He provides, you give)

With liberality

Sometimes out of your own poverty

Planned

Not grudgingly

Cheerfully

In addition, you sometimes should meet specific needs
