It is only through being transformed into Christ's image that men become distinctly Christian in their headship

Men In The Image of God Men distinctly reflect God's image through headship

Man's name (Adam) also name for mankind (adam)

God created Adam first (1 Tim 2:13) Adam responsible for giving God's instructions to Eve

Headship emphasizes responsibility to lead

Woman was made "for" the man

Woman was made "from" the man

The man named the woman

Her name ("ishah") was built from his name ("ish")

Evidences of male headship in Gen 1-2

Leading - Adam to teach Eve God's instructions, to lead her away from the serpent back to God 2

Providing - God put Adam in the garden to cultivate it 3

Protecting - Adam should have protected Eve from the serpent and his lies
