## Solomon's first collection (Prov 1:1-9:18)

Encounter the quest: godly wisdom and its foundation (1:1-7)

Take up the quest: 12 poems of a father (1:8-8:36)

Ten speeches by a loving father ("my son(s)")

Two portraits of Lady Wisdom

Guides on the quest: Rival speeches by Lady Wisdom and

Dame Folly (9:1-18)

## What way is it?

- I. Receive instruction in God's delightful way (8-9)
- II. Reject the appeals to join the sinner's deceptive way (10-14)
- III. Remember the consequences of the sinner's disastrous way (15-18)

Bruce Waltke, (Proverbs, 1:186)

"The tender address, my son...connotes that the father considers his son as his spiritual heir, not merely his biological offspring (see 4:3)"

Bruce Waltke, (Proverbs, 1:195)

"Evil" in Proverbs:

"Solomon's proverbs define "evil" from the point of view of Israel's covenant-keeping God" PROV 1:8-9 AND PS 73:25-28

The most precious jewel in God's way is a personal relationship with God Himself!

The basic idea in Prov 1:17 is that sinners "set an ambush for themselves...it is pointless to throw a net toward any flying creature, for God has given it the good sense to avoid it"
