Beauty of Proverbs 2 Structure

א Aleph "A"

If you pursue wisdom (1-4)

Then come two results (5-11)

1: "Then you will understand" to whom wisdom is leading you (5-8)

2: "Then you will understand" wisdom's path (9-11)

Three truths to motivate you to search for wisdom (Prov 2:5)

- I. Your aggressive search will be rewarded
- II. Your reward is to discover and possess the greatest treasure
- III. You will enjoy the deep riches of a relationship with God




Proverbs 2:5

Understand – to gain insight, such as how we view God and relate to Him


Find - "to discover or attain" something In Prov 3:13, "find" is parallel to "obtaining"

To find "implies an aggressive search, not a chance happening" (Waltke, *Proverbs*, I:257)

We discover and attain this knowledge after an aggressive search




Pursuing wisdom and knowing God build on each other

Fear of Yahweh - the believer's attitude toward God



Fear of Yahweh - Filial Fear

Seeking wisdom, knowing God
