Two Basic Views On Temporary Gifts Cessationists believe that some spiritual gifts ceased operating after the Apostolic era

Continuationists believe that all of the spiritual gifts are still in operation today

"With the New Testament revelation now complete, Scripture becomes the sole test of the authenticity of a man's message, and confirming signs of a miraculous nature are no longer necessary to validate a man or his message (1 Corinthians 13:8-12). Miraculous gifts can even be counterfeited by Satan so as to deceive even believers."

"Teleios" (1 Cor 13:10)

Perfect? Not in the NT!

- State of completion
- Becoming full-grown (mature, as in adulthood)
- Having reached its goal
- Contrasted with "the partial" (1 Cor 13:9-10)

Partially revealed truth is the opposite of the completely revealed truth





- Discipling
- Counseling

Equipping Gifts

Helps or Serving

- Taking up someone's burden
- Coming to their aid
- Assist someone
- Provide more extensive help
- Helping the weak

Administrations or Leading

Giving

- Gives sacrificially

Showing mercy
