MISSION TRIP

What will we be doing?

For several years now, Grace Bible Church has been supporting the work of a few missionaries in France: Alan and Ann Cochet, serving with Mission to the World, and John Hugh and Linda Tate, who helped plant Emmanuel International Church in the Rive Gauche district of Paris just a few years ago. For this trip, we'll be working with the Tates' church. The Tates' long-term goal in Paris is to help plant a family of churches across the city. By mentoring leaders and discipling those leaders to mentor others, they are excited to bring the gospel to light in a culture that is highly secularized and resistant to the gospel. Emmanuel International Church meets in Le Denfert Cafe. Yes, *you read that right*: their church meets in a coffee shop and not just any coffee shop but one that's owned by Muslims. Every Sunday, at 3:30 pm, around 75+ people from various countries, including France, gather to worship together. Then, during the week, the church hosts and coordinates opportunities to reach others through small group meetings, apologetics-focused gatherings, campus evangelism, and other forms of community outreach. During this trip, we will assist with and take part in these various forms of ministry, plus anything else that serves their purpose.

Once our short-term team is formed, we will have 3 team meetings, one of which will be with the missionaries on the field. Please note that our general disposition at Grace during any short-term mission trip is to do whatever is needed to serve the long-term purposes of the churches and ministries we are working with. Other needs could arise, meaning flexibility is necessary for this and any other mission trip we go on.

When are we going?

Depending on the total number of team members, it's likely that we will leave on Friday evening, **March 6**, or Saturday morning, **March 7**, from Memphis or Atlanta. Once the team is set, we will coordinate together on the best flight dates. The latest arrival date back to the U.S. will be Sunday, **March 15**, though it could be a day or two sooner.

How much will it cost?

The current estimate is **\$2,000 to \$2,250 per person**. This will include travel to, from, and within Paris, materials and other costs related to our mission activities, meals, and lodging for the entire trip. However, the cost you pay to Grace Bible Church will not include tourist activities; for that, our team will decide what to do, if anything, during the trip. Note that this is an estimated price range. Our "on-the-ground" costs are a set price. However, airfare, and travel to and from the airport, is the reason for flexibility in cost. A small portion of the above costs may be taken care of through available mission scholarships at Grace. We will also provide you some assistance on how to individually raise some or all of these funds in the case that is needed.

What are the team details?

Our team will, at max, consist of 12 people. Parker Hudson, Student Minister at Grace Bible Church, and Tyler Bolen, member of Grace Bible Church and Associate Director of the Baptist Student Union, will be leading this trip. Parker was a part of the team that went to Paris in March of 2025.

What if I want to go?

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What is required of me?

We require that all participants be professing and practicing Christians, preferably with some cross-cultural evangelism experience and/or adequate experience evangelizing in their home country. Preference will be given to members of Grace and then non-members (in the case that we must prioritize some over others). After your application has been received and accepted, to lock in your spot participants will need to pay a \$200 non-refundable deposit, which will be applied to the overall trip cost. Participants will also be required to sign a commitment form for their airfare to be purchased, stipulating that in the case you choose not to go (after airfare and lodging are purchased), you will be required to pay all cancellation/change fees associated with that decision (that is, any charges exceeding your \$200 deposit).

What else do I need now?

No vaccinations are required for entry to France. No visa is required for this trip.

If you don't have a passport, please order one now (and I would recommend expediting it). If you already have one, it needs to be good for three months past March 15, 2026. Your passport needs to have at least one blank page left.

What is the deadline to apply?

We will lock in our team by the second week of December so that we can purchase airfare well ahead of the trip. Thus, the deadline to apply is **December 14, 2025**. Once the team is locked in, we will have a monthly preparation and training meeting (one in January, one in February, and one in March). These meetings also help build team comradery before we go. Our preference is that you attend these meetings in-person, though remote participation will be made available.
