1 Peter 5:6-14; "The Two Supporters and One Accuser," Pastor Tim Cho

Ice Breaker: Share a particularly meaningful goodbye you had with someone close to you.

Big Idea: Satan is against you but God is for you, so stand firm in the faith with your church.

Dig:

1. Verse 6 uses "therefore;" so, look back at 1 Peter 5:1-5. What is the context for Peter's instructions in verses 6-9? What reasons does he give for his instructions? What reassurances does he give?
2. How do verses 10-14 sum up the pressures these believers were facing, as well as Peter's advice on this matter?
3. Given that Peter is writing this letter from Rome, what does he mean by his reference to "Babylon" in verse 13?

Apply:

4. What anxieties do you have in your life that God wants you to cast on Him? What steps will you take to do so?
5. Where in your life is Satan prowling for opportunities to devour you? What steps will you take to stay spiritually alive?
6. Reflect on lessons you're taking away from this series in 1 Peter. What are one or two that are making a difference in your life right now?
