Genesis 42: "The Sin that Remains"

Q: What effects will unrepentant sin have in a person's life?

Big Idea: While unrepentant sin will haunt you all your days, Jesus seeks your repentance to heal you in all your ways.

Ice Breaker: What is the longest time you have been separated from your family? What was memorable about your reunion?

Dig:

- 1. As this passage opens in vv1-5, what circumstances did Jacob and his family experience? Look on a Bible map to ascertain about how far the ten sons had to travel.
- 2. Why were Joseph's brothers unable to recognize him? Why did Joseph treat his brothers so harshly? How do you square that with Joseph's behaviors in vv24-26?
- 3. In vv22 and 37, we hear from Reuben. Look back to Genesis 35:22 and 37:21-30. Describe Reuben's character. How has it changed (or not)? Why or why not?
- 4. What do you learn about Joseph's other brothers in this chapter? How they interpret the unfolding events? Why? How does Jacob interpret the unfolding events? Why?

Apply:

- 5. Where in your life now are you still paying the price or reaping the effects of a mistake you made or a sin you committed? How is God speaking to you about this?
- 6. As you reflect on Jacob's misunderstanding of his situation in this passage, what help do you find for your own prayer life in your current situation?
