It was a learning process on the immigration status we sought here in Costa Rica. And here we are over here, a later serving the Lord with permission to be in the country. In 2023 we



applied for a religious visa. It may be 6-12 months before we receive a response from the immigration office. Personally, we have become confident that we can stay in the



country but ask for continuous prayer. Men draw up borders, and in cases within nations, they go to war over the borders. But it is a blessing to remember that God made this planet, and he decided this matter. We are here for a purpose; that purpose is to glorify God. Unless he says otherwise, we are here for his glory. So, we are serving without worrying.

Responsibility Changes

In December, the Academy's Board decided on several excellent changes. The one that affects me the most is that I was appointed to be the first Dean of Students. This will allow me to put my full, undivided attention and effort into organizing and promoting the Academy and nurturing and supporting the students and professors.

This new role allows me to make direct and full use of my degree in Christian Education. I am very excited about this.



As the Dean, I will be engaged in a wide range of tasks and duties. These responsibilities include developing and facilitating learning plans in the context of tutoring, ensuring compliance with the educational student outlines, maintaining the student learning platform, allocating resources effectively, collaborating with the school

administrator, and promoting a culture of continuous improvement. I will be promoting the academy by engaging with various churches and their leaders and representing the school in multiple events and meetings. I will also assist and maintain partnerships with the professors to this same end.

The Board and I desire that the Academy does more than provide needed biblical and theological training. We want to challenge and assist every student to keep striving forward in Christ.



New Role, New Location

it necessary for us to relocate to a more central location. In doing so, I will have access to a broader network of churches for visiting and promoting the academy. I will be able to serve the students better by living closer to more of them. To do all of this we must choose a place wisely.

Finding a church is also a priority. We have visited good churches and plan to visit more before making our decision.

Travel

As the Dean, it is important that we visit the churches that Pastor Sanelli assisted to form the Academy. We have and it has been a blessing to start working alongside each of them more directly than before to further the Academy.

I like moving around on foot and by bus, but meetings between cities by bus will be time-consuming in the future. The second reason is that we do not have a car here in Costa Rica. It is still sitting in Tijuana, Mexico. We need our own vehicle. I am confident that in his timing, God will provide for this need.

Future Mission Trips




