# **Proposition and Outline**

In <u>Matthew 4:18-22</u>, Matthew describes Jesus's call of His first disciples to follow Him. As we study this text, you must consider that His call is:

- 2. Paradigm-shifting (Matt 4:20, 22)
- 3. Purposeful (Matt 4:19)
- 4. Powerful [effectual] (Matt 4:20, 22)
- 5. Pressing (<u>Matt 4:20</u>, <u>21</u>)

# You must Consider that His call is <u>Personal!</u> (<u>Matt 4:18</u>, <u>21</u>)

<u>Matthew 4:18</u> (LSB) <sup>18</sup> Now as *Jesus* was walking by the Sea of Galilee, He saw two brothers, Simon who was called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen.

## The Various Phases of Jesus's Call of His disciples Explained

### The First Phase of Jesus's Call

#### John 1:35–40 LSB

<sup>35</sup> On the next day, John again was standing with two of his disciples, <sup>36</sup> and he looked at Jesus as He walked, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God!" <sup>37</sup> And the two disciples heard him speak and followed Jesus. <sup>38</sup> And when Jesus turned and noticed them following, He said to them, "What do you seek?" They said to Him, "Rabbi (which translated means Teacher), where are You staying?" <sup>39</sup> He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they came and saw where He was staying; and they stayed with Him that day. It was about the tenth hour. <sup>40</sup> One of

the two who heard John *speak* and followed Him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother.

#### John 1:47–50 LSB

<sup>47</sup> Jesus saw Nathanael coming to Him, and said about him, "Behold, truly an Israelite in whom there is no deceit!" <sup>48</sup> Nathanael said to Him, "From where do You know me?" Jesus answered and said to him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." <sup>49</sup> Nathanael answered Him, "Rabbi, You are the Son of God; You are the King of Israel." <sup>50</sup> Jesus answered and said to him, "Because I said to you that I saw you under the fig tree, do you believe? You will see greater things than these."

## The Second Phase of Jesus's Call

Matthew 4:19 LSB

<sup>19</sup> And He said to them, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men."

## The Third Phase of Jesus's Call

Luke 5:10 (LSB) <sup>10</sup> and James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon, *were* also likewise *amazed*. And Jesus said to Simon, <u>"Do not fear, from now on you will be catching men."</u>

Luke 5:11 (LSB) <sup>11</sup> And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed Him.

## The Fourth Phase of Jesus's Call

#### Mark 3:13-15 LSB

<sup>13</sup> And He went up on the mountain and summoned those whom He Himself wanted, and they came to Him. <sup>14</sup> And He appointed twelve (whom He also named apostles) to be with Him and to send them out to preach, <sup>15</sup> and to have authority to cast out the demons.

#### Luke 6:12-16 LSB

<sup>12</sup> Now it happened that at this time He went off to the mountain to pray, and He was spending the whole night in prayer to God. <sup>13</sup> And when day came, He called His disciples to Him and chose twelve of them, whom He also named as apostles: <sup>14</sup> Simon, whom He also named Peter, and Andrew his brother; and James and John; and Philip and Bartholomew; <sup>15</sup> and Matthew and Thomas;

James *the son* of Alphaeus, and Simon who was called the Zealot; <sup>16</sup> Judas *the son* of James, and Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor.

## The Fifth Phase of Jesus's Call

<u>Matthew 10:1</u> (LSB) <sup>1</sup> And summoning His twelve disciples, <u>Jesus gave them</u> <u>authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every kind of</u> <u>disease and every kind of sickness.</u>

## The Sixth Phase of Jesus's Call??

Acts 1:8-9 LSB

<sup>8</sup> but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to THE END OF THE EARTH." <sup>9</sup> And after He had said these things, He was lifted up while they were looking on, and a cloud received Him out of their sight.

## Jesus Called Them By Name

<u>Matthew 4:18</u> (LSB) <sup>18</sup> Now as *Jesus* was walking by the Sea of Galilee, <u>He saw</u> <u>two brothers</u>, <u>Simon who was called Peter</u>, <u>and Andrew his brother</u>, <u>casting a</u> <u>net into the sea; for they were fishermen</u>.

#### Matthew 4:21 LSB

<sup>21</sup> And going on from there He saw two other brothers, James the *son* of Zebedee, and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets; and He called them.

A man once asked him to officiate as a lawyer or judge, but he replied, "Who made me a judge or a divider over you?" <u>One beauty of Christ's life was that he kept to his calling and did not go beyond his commission. And you will be wise if you do the same.</u> ~ **Charles Spurgeon**

Luke 19:1-4 LSB

<sup>1</sup> And He entered Jericho and was passing through. <sup>2</sup> And behold, there was a man called by the name of Zaccheus; he was a chief tax collector and he was rich. <sup>3</sup> And Zaccheus was trying to see who Jesus was, and was unable because of the crowd, for he was small in stature. <sup>4</sup> So he ran on before and climbed up into a sycamore tree in order to see Him, for He was about to pass through that way.

#### Luke 19:5-9 LSB
