The King and His Glory / Sermon on the Mount/Plain; Salvation; Righteousness; Holiness / Matthew 5–7

In the Sermon on the Mount (Matt 5-7), the King's Manifesto for His Kingdom, King Jesus reveals seven difficult truths about His Kingdom.

Pre-sermon Comments

Ecclesiastes 1:9 LSB

⁹ That which has been is that which will be, And that which has been done is that which will be done. So there is nothing new under the sun.

<u>Genesis 6:5</u> (LSB) ⁵ Then Yahweh saw that the evil of man was great on the earth, and that <u>every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.</u>

¹ But know this, that in the last days difficult times will come.

² For men will be lovers of self, lovers of money, boastful, arrogant, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy, ³ unloving, irreconcilable, malicious gossips, without self-control, without gentleness, without love for good, ⁴ treacherous, reckless, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, ⁵ holding to a form of godliness, but having denied its power. Keep away from such men as these.

<u>1 John 5:19</u> (LSB) ¹⁹ We know that we are of God, and <u>that the whole world lies</u> in *the power of* the evil one.

<u>2 Corinthians 4:4</u> (LSB) ⁴ in whose case <u>the god of this age has blinded the minds of the unbelieving</u> so that they might not see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.

Matthew 5:17-20 LSB

¹⁷ "Do not think that I came to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I did not come to abolish but to fulfill. ¹⁸ "For truly I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or stroke shall pass from the Law until all is accomplished. ¹⁹ "Whoever then annuls one of the least of these commandments, and teaches others *to do* the same, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does and teaches *them*, he shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven. ²⁰ "For I say to you that unless your righteousness surpasses *that* of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.

Matthew 5:1 LSB

¹ Now when Jesus saw the crowds, He went up on the mountain; and after He sat down, His disciples came to Him.

Matthew 5:3–12 (LSB) ³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. ⁴ Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. ⁵ Blessed are the lowly, for they shall inherit the earth. ⁶ Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied. ⁷ Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy. ⁸ Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God. ⁹ Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God. ¹⁰ Blessed are those who have been persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. ¹¹ "Blessed are you when people insult you and persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of Me. ¹² "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward in heaven is great; for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

<u>Matthew 5:10</u> (LSB) ¹⁰ <u>Blessed are those who have been persecuted for the sake of righteousness,</u> for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

King Jesus Reveals His Holy Call to Become His Kingdom Citizens (Matt 5:13-16)

Matthew 5:13 LSB

¹³ "You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt has become tasteless, how will it be made salty *again*? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out to be trampled under foot by men.

Matthew 5:14-15 LSB

¹⁴ "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden; ¹⁵ nor does *anyone* light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house.

Matthew 5:16 LSB

¹⁶ "Let your light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father who is in heaven.

King Jesus Reveals His Holy Standard for His Kingdom Citizens (Matt 5:17-48)

Matthew 5:17 LSB

¹⁷ "Do not think that I came to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I did not come to abolish but to fulfill.

Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament by being its fulfillment. He did not simply teach it fully and exemplify it fully—He was it fully. He did not come simply to teach righteousness and to model righteousness; He came as divine righteousness. What He said and what He did reflected who He is. ~ John MacArthur

² "Speak to all the congregation of the sons of Israel and say to them, 'You shall be holy, for I, Yahweh your God, am holy.

¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

King Jesus Reveals His Holy Standard of Kingdom Righteousness (Matt 6:1-7:12)

Matthew 6:1 LSB

¹ "Beware of doing your righteousness before men to be noticed by them; otherwise you have no reward with your Father who is in heaven.

Luke 18:9-14 LSB

⁹ And He also told this parable to some people who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and viewed others with contempt: ¹⁰ "Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. ¹¹ "The Pharisee stood and was praying these things to himself: 'God, I thank You that I am not like other people: swindlers, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. ¹² 'I fast twice a week; I pay tithes of all that I get.' ¹³ "But the tax collector, standing some distance away, was even unwilling to lift up his eyes to heaven, but was beating his chest, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, the sinner!' ¹⁴ "I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other, for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself will be exalted."

King Jesus Reveals the Holy Standard for

Entry into the Kingdom (Matt 7:13-14)

Matthew 7:13-14 LSB

¹³ "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is broad that leads to destruction, and there are many who enter through it. ¹⁴ "For the gate is narrow and the way is constricted that leads to life, and there are few who find it.

<u>Isaiah 64:6</u> (LSB) ⁶ For all of us have become like one who is unclean, <u>And all our righteous deeds are like a filthy garment</u>; And all of us wither like a leaf, And our iniquities, like the wind, carry us away.

Romans 3:23 LSB

²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

1 John 3:12 LSB

¹² not as Cain, *who* was of the evil one and slew his brother. And for what reason did he slay him? Because his deeds were evil, and his brother's were righteous.

Genesis 4:3-5 LSB

³ So it happened in the course of time that Cain brought an offering to Yahweh of the fruit of the ground. ⁴ Abel, on his part, also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat portions. And Yahweh had regard for Abel and for his offering; ⁵ but for Cain and for his offering He had no regard. So Cain became very angry, and his countenance fell.

²⁴ being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus; ²⁵ whom God displayed publicly as a propitiation in His blood through faith, for a demonstration of His righteousness, because in the forbearance of God He passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶ for the demonstration of His righteousness at the present time, so that He would be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

King Jesus Reveals His Holy Warning Against False Converts (Matt 7:15-23)

Matthew 7:22-23 LSB

²² "Many will say to Me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, in Your name did we not prophesy, and in Your name cast out demons, and in Your name do many miracles?' ²³ "And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; DEPART FROM ME, YOU WHO PRACTICE LAWLESSNESS.'

King Jesus Reveals His Holy Wisdom for Righteous Living (Matt 7:24-27)

Matthew 7:24-27 LSB

²⁴ "Therefore everyone who hears these words of Mine and does them, may be compared to a wise man who built his house on the rock. ²⁵ "And the rain descended, and the rivers came, and the winds blew and fell against that house; and *yet* it did not fall, for it had been founded on the rock. ²⁶ "And everyone hearing these words of Mine and not doing them, may be compared to a foolish man who built his house on the sand. ²⁷ "And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew and slammed against that house; and it fell—and great was its fall."
