By God's grace, Matthew went from being a helper of the priests to being a helper of the Herod's to becoming the helper of Jesus - our Great High Priest! What an incredible transformation!

 - Acknowledge your poverty of spirit your helplessness and your hopelessness.
 - Mourn over your sin.

Review

Matthew 5:3-4 LSB

³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. ⁴ Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

What does it mean to be blessed?

Blessing is the state of happiness in our inward selves. It comes from the acknowledgement of the reality of how fortunate we are to have a relationship with God the Father through Jesus the Son. This relationship produces an inner bliss and contentment that comes from an ever-increasing recognition of all that God has done for us and that no circumstance or set of circumstances can change our happiness or contentment in Christ.

Who is the source of blessing?

God Himself is the source of this blessing. Therefore, we can only be truly blessed by partaking in His divine nature. As the psalmist promises, "In His presence is fullness of joy and in His right hand are pleasures forever" (Ps 16:11).

Psalm 16:11 LSB

¹¹ You will make known to me the path of life; In Your presence is fullness of joy; In Your right hand there are pleasures forever.

Who are the Blessed?

The blessed are those who have believed in the promises of Christ and are living in the present reality of the Holy Spirit living within them with an ever-increasing understanding of what He is accomplishing through them.

Matthew 5:3 (LSB) ³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

What does it mean to be Poor in Spirit?

Poor in Spirit: Jesus is saying that God blesses a person who recognizes their spiritual bankruptcy or destitution. They must recognize their lostness in sin, hopelessness in life, and helplessness to save themselves. They must see that they are utterly unworthy of God and are completely dependent upon Him to save them. They must cry out like Isaiah, "Woe is me, for I am ruined! For I am a

man of unclean lips, And I live among a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, Yahweh of hosts" (<u>Isa 6:5</u>).

Isaiah 6:5 LSB

⁵ Then I said, "Woe is me, for I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, And I live among a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, Yahweh of hosts."

Matthew 5:3 (LSB) ³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Step Two: Persevere in Learning What Offends God (Matt 5:4)

Matthew 5:4 LSB

⁴ Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

What does Jesus mean by mourning?

Godly mourning is a deep and abiding sorrow that is produced by the knowledge of our sin and how far we fall short of God's glory. This type of mourning can only be experienced by those who have recognized their spiritual poverty and desperate need of God's mercy and grace. We see this type of mourning in the lives of saints like Isaiah (Isa 6:5) and David (Ps 32:3-4 & Ps 51:3-4).

Isaiah 6:1 LSB

¹ In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up, with the train of His robe filling the temple.

Psalm 32:3-4 LSB

³ When I kept silent *about my sin*, my bones wasted away Through my groaning all day long. ⁴ For day and night Your hand was heavy upon me; My vitality was drained away *as* with the heat of summer. Selah.

Psalm 51:3-4 LSB

³ For I know my transgressions, And my sin is ever before me. ⁴ Against You, You only, I have sinned *And* done what is evil in Your sight, So that You are justified when You speak And pure when You judge.

<u>Psalm 32:1–2</u> (LSB) ¹ <u>How blessed</u> is he whose transgression is forgiven, Whose sin is covered! ² <u>How blessed</u> is the man whose iniquity Yahweh will not take into account, And in whose spirit there is no deceit!

How does God bless our mourning?

Matthew 5:4 LSB

⁴ Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

What does comforted mean?

John 14:16-17 LSB

¹⁶ "And I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Advocate, that He may be with you forever; ¹⁷ the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it does not see Him or know Him. You know Him because He abides with you and will be in you.

Isaiah 61:2–3 (LSB) ² To proclaim the favorable year of Yahweh And the day of vengeance of our God, To comfort all who mourn, ³ To grant those who mourn *in* Zion, Giving them a headdress instead of ashes, The oil of rejoicing instead of mourning, The mantle of praise instead of a spirit of fainting. So they will be called oaks of righteousness, The planting of Yahweh, that He may show forth His beautiful glory.

Psalm 23:4 LSB

⁴ Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.

³ Blessed *be* the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort,

⁴ who comforts us in all our affliction so that we will be able to comfort those who are in any affliction with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God.

<u>2 Corinthians 1:1</u> (LSB) ¹ <u>Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy *our* brother, **To** the church of God which is at Corinth with all the saints who are throughout Achaia:</u>

2 Corinthians 1:5 LSB

⁵ For just as the sufferings of Christ abound to us, so also our comfort abounds through Christ.

The blessing of God's comfort is reserved exclusively for the contrite of heart. It is only those who mourn for sin who will have their tears wiped away by the loving hand of Jesus Christ. ~ John MacArthur

<u>2 Thessalonians 2:16</u> (LSB) ¹⁶ Now may our Lord Jesus Christ Himself and God our Father, who <u>has loved us and given us eternal comfort and good hope by grace,</u>

How do we receive this comfort?

Romans 7:24 LSB

²⁴ Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from the body of this death?

1 John 1:9 LSB

⁹ If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Matthew 11:28 LSB

²⁸ "Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest.

As often as we confess our sin, He is faithful to forgive, and for as long as we mourn over sin He is faithful to comfort. ~ John MacArthur

Who is the Man who Mourns?

[The man who mourns] is a sorrowful man, but he is not morose. He is a sorrowful man, but he is not a miserable man. He is a serious man, but he is not a sullen man. He is a grave man, but he is never cold or prohibitive. There is with his gravity a warmth and attraction. This man, in other words, is always serious; but he does not have to affect the seriousness. The true Christian is never a man who has to put on an appearance of either sadness or joviality. No, no; he is a man who looks at life seriously; he contemplates it spiritually, and he sees in it sin

and its effects. He is a serious, sober-minded man. His outlook is always serious, but because of these views which he has, and his understanding of truth, he also has 'a joy unspeakable and full of glory'. So he is like the apostle Paul, 'groaning within himself', and yet happy because of his experience of Christ and the glory that is to come. The Christian is not superficial in any sense, but is fundamentally serious and fundamentally happy. You see, the joy of the Christian is a holy joy, the happiness of the Christian is a serious happiness. None of that superficial appearance of happiness and joy! No, no; it is a solemn joy, it is a holy joy, it is a serious happiness; so that, though he is grave and sober-minded and serious, he is never cold and prohibitive. Indeed, he is like our Lord Himself, groaning, weeping, and yet, 'for the joy that was set before him' enduring the cross, despising the shame. ~ Martyn Lloyd Jones

Practical Steps for Mourning and Receiving Supernatural Comfort

You need to develop a deep doctrine of sin

Romans 7:18 LSB

¹⁸ For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh; for the willing is present in me, but the working out of the good *is* not.

Jeremiah 17:9 LSB

⁹ "The heart is more deceitful than all else And is desperately sick; Who can know it?

You need to develop a clear understanding of God's holiness

Isaiah 6:1–5 (LSB) ¹ In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up, with the train of His robe filling the temple. ² Seraphim stood above Him, each having six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. ³ And one called out to another and said, "Holy, Holy, Holy, is Yahweh of hosts; The whole earth is full of His glory." ⁴ And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called out, while the house of God was filling with smoke. ⁵ Then I said, "Woe is me, for I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, And I live among a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, Yahweh of hosts."

Revelation 1:13-17 LSB

¹³ and in the middle of the lampstands *I saw* one like a son of man, clothed in a robe reaching to the feet, and girded across His chest with a golden sash. ¹⁴ And His head and His hair were white like white wool, like snow; and His eyes were like a flame of fire. ¹⁵ His feet *were* like burnished bronze, when it has been made to glow in a furnace, and His voice *was* like the sound of many waters, ¹⁶ and having in His right hand seven stars, and a sharp two-edged sword which comes out of His mouth, and His face was like the sun shining in its power. ¹⁷ And when I saw Him, I fell at His feet like a dead man. ² I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago—whether in the body I do not know, or out of the body I do not know, God knows—such a man was caught up to the third heaven. ³ And I know how such a man—whether in the body or apart from the body I do not know, God knows— ⁴ was caught up into Paradise and heard inexpressible words, which a man is not permitted to speak.

You need to develop a high doctrine of joy

1 Peter 1:8 LSB

⁸ And though you have not seen Him, you love Him, and though you do not see Him now, but believe in Him, you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory,

1 Peter 1:9 LSB

⁹ receiving as the outcome of your faith the salvation of your souls.

You need to read, study, and meditate on Scripture

2 Peter 1:18-21 LSB

¹⁸ and we ourselves heard this utterance made from heaven when we were with Him on the holy mountain. ¹⁹ And we have as more sure the prophetic word, to which you do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star arises in your hearts. ²⁰ Know this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes by one's own interpretation. ²¹ For no prophecy was ever made by the will of man, but men being moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

2 Timothy 3:16-17 LSB

¹⁶ All Scripture is God-breathed and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ so that the man of God may be equipped, having been thoroughly equipped for every good work.

You need to pray that God will reveal the truth of these things to you

Step Three: Pursue Lowliness (Matt 5:5)

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
