Introduction

The cruelties used in this persecution were such that many of the spectators shuddered with horror at the sight, and were astonished at the intrepidity of the sufferers. Sermon Text

Matthew 5:1–12 (LSB) ¹ Now when Jesus saw the crowds, He went up on the mountain; and after He sat down, His disciples came to Him. ² And He opened His mouth and *began to* teach them, saying, ³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. ⁴ Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. ⁵ Blessed are the lowly, for they shall inherit the earth. ⁶ Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied. ⁷ Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy. ⁸ Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God. ⁹ Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God. ¹⁰ Blessed are those who have been persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. ¹¹ "Blessed are you when *people* insult you and persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of Me. ¹² "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward in heaven is great; for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Review

The first four steps

Ephesians 1:13–14 (LSB) ¹³ In Him, you also, after listening to the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation—<u>having also believed, you were sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit of promise,</u> ¹⁴ who is given as a pledge of our inheritance, unto the redemption of *God's own* possession, to the praise of His glory.

¹⁷ Therefore if anyone is in Christ, *he is* a new creation; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come.

Steps five through seven

Matthew 5:6 (LSB) ⁶ Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.

Matthew 5:7 (LSB) ⁷ Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy.

Matthew 5:8 (LSB) 8 Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.

Matthew 5:9 (LSB) ⁹ Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.

John 15:18–20 (LSB) ¹⁸ "If the world hates you, know that it has hated Me before *it hated* you. ¹⁹ "If you were of the world, the world would love its own; but because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, because of this the world hates you. ²⁰ "Remember the word that I said to you, 'A slave is not greater than his master.' If they persecuted Me, they will also persecute you; if they kept My word, they will keep yours also.

Last Steps: Patiently Endure Persecution, Slander. and Libel for Righteousness' Sake (Matt 5:10-11)

Matthew 5:10 LSB

¹⁰ Blessed are those who have been persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

<u>2 Timothy 3:12</u> (LSB) ¹² Indeed, all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will be persecuted.

What is persecution?

The Definition of Persecution

The genuine Christian says - "I will take up my cross and follow Christ no matter the cost. I will do His work no matter the difficulty. I will proclaim His mighty name no matter the opposition."

The Nature of Persecution

Categories of Persecution

Luke 11:47–51 (LSB) ⁴⁷ "Woe to you! For you build the tombs of the prophets, but your fathers killed them. ⁴⁸ "So you are witnesses and approve the deeds of your fathers; because it was they who killed them, and you build their tombs. ⁴⁹ "For this reason also the wisdom of God said, 'I will send to them prophets and apostles, and some of them they will kill and some they will persecute, ⁵⁰ so that the blood of all the prophets, shed since the foundation of the world, may be charged against this generation, ⁵¹ from the blood of Abel to the blood of Zechariah, who was killed between the altar and the house of God; yes, I tell you, it shall be charged against this generation.'

Matthew 23:32–35 (LSB) ³² "Fill up, then, the measure of the guilt of your fathers. ³³ "You serpents, you brood of vipers, how will you escape the sentence of hell? ³⁴ "On account of this, behold, I am sending you prophets and wise men and scribes; some of them you will kill and crucify, and some of them you will flog in your synagogues, and persecute from city to city, ³⁵ so that upon you may fall *the guilt of* all the righteous blood shed on earth, from the blood of righteous Abel to the blood of Zechariah, the son of Berechiah, whom you murdered between the sanctuary and the altar.

Physical Persecution

Deprivation (Hunger and thirst)

<u>2 Corinthians 11:27</u> (LSB) ²⁷ *I have been* in labor and hardship, in many sleepless nights, in starvation and thirst, often hungry, in cold and without enough clothing.

<u>2 Timothy 4:13</u> (LSB) ¹³ When you come <u>bring the cloak which I left at Troas</u> with Carpus, and the scrolls, especially the parchments.

Physical beatings and martyrdom

<u>Luke 11:51</u> (LSB) ⁵¹ <u>from the blood of Abel to the blood of Zechariah, who was killed between the altar and the house *of God*; yes, I tell you, it shall be charged against this generation.'</u>

<u>Genesis 4:8</u> (LSB) ⁸ Then Cain spoke to Abel his brother; and it happened when they were in the field, <u>that Cain rose up against Abel his brother and killed him.</u>

Genesis 3:15 (LSB) ¹⁵ And I will put enmity Between you and the woman, And between your seed and her seed; <u>He shall bruise you on the head,</u> And you shall bruise him on the heel."

<u>1 John 3:12</u> (LSB) ¹² not as Cain, *who* was of the evil one and slew his brother. And for what reason did he slay him? <u>Because his deeds were evil, and his brother's were righteous.</u>

<u>2 Chronicles 24:20–21</u> (LSB) ²⁰ Now the Spirit of God clothed Zechariah the son of Jehoiada the priest; and he stood above the people and said to them, "Thus says God, 'Why do you trespass against the commandments of Yahweh and do not succeed? Because you have forsaken Yahweh, He has also forsaken you.'" ²¹ So they conspired against him and <u>at the command of the king they stoned him to death in the court of the house of Yahweh.</u>

Acts 7:52–53 (LSB) ⁵² "And which one of the prophets did your fathers not persecute? They killed those who had previously announced the coming of the Righteous One, whose betrayers and murderers you have now become; ⁵³ you who received the Law as ordained by angels, and *yet* did not observe it."

Acts 7:54 LSB

⁵⁴ Now when they heard this, they became furious in their hearts, and they *began* gnashing their teeth at him.

Romans 1:32 (LSB) ³² and although they know the righteous requirement of God, that those who practice such things are worthy of death, they not only do the same, <u>but also give hearty approval to those who practice them.</u>

Acts 7:57–60 (LSB) ⁵⁷ But crying out with a loud voice, they covered their ears and rushed at him with one accord. ⁵⁸ And when they had driven him out of the city, they began stoning him; and the witnesses laid aside their garments at the feet of a young man named Saul. ⁵⁹ They went on stoning Stephen as he was calling out and saying, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit!" ⁶⁰ Then falling on his knees, he cried out with a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them!" And having said this, he fell asleep.

Acts 14:19–20 (LSB) ¹⁹ But Jews came from Antioch and Iconium, and after winning over the crowds and stoning Paul, they were dragging him out of the city, supposing him to be dead. ²⁰ But while the disciples stood around him, he rose up and entered the city. The next day he went away with Barnabas to Derbe.

Acts 16:22–24 (LSB)²² And the crowd joined together to attack them, and the chief magistrates, tearing their garments off of them, proceeded to order them to be beaten with rods. ²³ And when they had inflicted them with many wounds, they threw them into prison, commanding the jailer to guard them securely, ²⁴ who, having received such a command, threw them into the inner prison and fastened their feet in the stocks.

Subjection to imprisonment and other harsh conditions

<u>2 Timothy 4:6–7</u> (LSB) ⁶ For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure has come. ⁷ I have fought the good fight, I have finished the course, I have kept the faith.

Matthew 14:3–12 (LSB) ³ For when Herod had John arrested, he bound him and put him in prison because of Herodias, the wife of his brother Philip. ⁴ For John had been saying to him, "It is not lawful for you to have her." ⁵ And although

Herod wanted to put him to death, he feared the crowd, because they were regarding John as a prophet. ⁶ But when Herod's birthday came, the daughter of Herodias danced before *them* and pleased Herod, ⁷ so *much* that he promised with an oath to give her whatever she asked. ⁸ Now having been prompted by her mother, she said, "Give me here on a platter the head of John the Baptist." ⁹ And although he was grieved, the king commanded *it* to be given because of his oaths, and because of his dinner guests. ¹⁰ And he sent and had John beheaded in the prison. ¹¹ And his head was brought on a platter and given to the girl, and she brought it to her mother. ¹² And his disciples came and took away the body and buried it; and they went and reported to Jesus.

Verbal Insults

Matthew 5:11 (LSB) ¹¹ "Blessed are you when *people* insult you and persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of Me.

Mark 14:64–65 (LSB) ⁶⁴ "You have heard the blasphemy; how does it seem to you?" And they all condemned Him to be deserving of death. ⁶⁵ And some began to spit at Him, and to blindfold Him, and to beat Him with their fists, and to say to Him, "Prophesy!" And the officers received Him with slaps *in the face*.

<u>2 Chronicles 36:15–16</u> (LSB) ¹⁵ And Yahweh, the God of their fathers, sent *word* to them again and again by the hand of His messengers, because He had compassion on His people and on His habitation; ¹⁶ but they *continually* mocked the messengers of God, despised His words and scoffed at His prophets, until the wrath of Yahweh arose against His people, until there was no remedy.

Acts 17:32–34 (LSB) ³² Now when they heard about the resurrection of the dead, some began to sneer, but others said, "We shall hear you again concerning this." ³³ In this way, Paul went out of their midst. ³⁴ But some men joined him and believed, among whom also were Dionysius the Areopagite and a woman named Damaris and others with them.

False Accusations

Matthew 5:11 (LSB) ¹¹ "Blessed are you when *people* insult you and persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of Me.

Slander

<u>1 Peter 3:13–18</u> (LSB) ¹³ And who is there to harm you if you prove zealous for what is good? ¹⁴ But even if you should suffer for the sake of righteousness, you are blessed. AND DO NOT FEAR THEIR FEAR, AND DO NOT BE TROUBLED, ¹⁵ but sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts, always *being* ready to make a defense to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you, yet with gentleness and fear, ¹⁶ having a good conscience so that in the thing in which you are slandered, those who disparage your good conduct in Christ will be put to shame. ¹⁷ For it is better, if God should will it so, that you suffer for doing good rather than for doing wrong. ¹⁸ For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, *the* righteous for *the* unrighteous, so that He might bring you to God, having been put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit;

Libel

<u>Proverbs 18:17</u> (LSB) ¹⁷ The first to plead his case *seems* right, *Until* another comes and examines him.

Do I need to seek persecution?

<u>Matthew 5:10</u> (LSB) ¹⁰ Blessed are those who <u>have been persecuted</u> for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

We are not to do anything that calls for persecution. But by just being like Christ persecution becomes inevitable. ~ Martyn Lloyd Jones

Can I avoid persecution?

God does not want His gospel altered under pretense of its being less demanding, less righteous, or less truthful than it is. He does not want witnesses who lead the unsaved into thinking that the Christ life costs nothing. A synthetic gospel, a man-made seed, produces no real fruit. ~ John MacArthur

<u>Matthew 5:12</u> (LSB) ¹² "<u>Rejoice and be glad</u>, for your reward in heaven is great; for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Persecutions are in a way seals of adoption to the children of God. ~ **John** Calvin

Hebrews 11:32–38 (LSB) ³² And what more shall I say? For time will fail me if I recount Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, as well as David and Samuel and the prophets, ³³ who through faith conquered kingdoms, performed righteousness, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, ³⁴ quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, were made strong from weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. ³⁵ Women received *back* their dead by resurrection; and others were tortured, not accepting their release, so that they might obtain a better resurrection; ³⁶ and others experienced mockings and floggings, yes, also chains and imprisonment. ³⁷ They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were tempted, they were put to death with the sword. They went about in sheepskins, in goatskins, being destitute, afflicted, mistreated ³⁸ (of whom the world was not worthy), wandering in desolate places and mountains and caves and holes in the ground.

Conclusion

Avoiding persecution is dangerous to your soul!

<u>Luke 6:26</u> (LSB) ²⁶ <u>Woe to you</u> when all men speak well of you, for their fathers were doing the same things to the false prophets.
