Growing in Faith and Love: A New Year's Resolution Worth Making!

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The Church: Growing in Faith and Love / Faith; Love / 1 Peter 1:3–15
As we approach 2024 and beyond with all the possibilities, the Apostle Peter gives three litmus tests for whether your faith is true and growing.

Pre-sermon Comments

Genesis 2:1–4 (LSB) ¹ Thus the heavens and the earth were completed, and all their hosts. ² And on the <u>seventh day</u> God completed His work which He had done, and He rested on the <u>seventh day</u> from all His work which He had done. ³ Then God blessed the <u>seventh day and sanctified it</u>, <u>because on it He rested from all His work which God had created in making it</u>. ⁴ These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created, in the day that Yahweh God made earth and heaven.

Revelation 1:20 (LSB) ²⁰ "As for the mystery of the seven stars which you saw in My right hand, and the seven golden lampstands: the seven stars are the angels of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands are the seven churches.

Philippians 3:7–8 (LSB) ⁷ But whatever things were gain to me, those things I have counted as loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸ More than that, I count all things to be loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them but rubbish so that I may gain Christ

<u>Philippians 3:10</u> (LSB) ¹⁰ that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death,

Philippians 3:11 (LSB) ¹¹ in order that I may attain to the resurrection from the dead.

Philippians 3:12 (LSB) ¹² Not that I have already obtained *it* or have already become perfect, but I press on so that I may lay hold of that for which also I was laid hold of by Christ Jesus.

Philippians 3:13 (LSB) ¹³ Brothers, I do not consider myself as having laid hold of *it* yet,

but one thing *I do*: forgetting what *lies* behind and reaching forward to what *lies* ahead,

Philippians 3:14 (LSB) ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

Sermon Text

2 Peter 1:2-7 LSB

² Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the full knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord; ³ seeing that His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the full knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence. ⁴ For by these He has granted to us His precious and magnificent promises, so that by them you may become partakers of *the* divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world by lust. ⁵ Now for this very reason also, applying all diligence, in your faith supply moral excellence,

and in *your* moral excellence, knowledge, ⁶ and in *your* knowledge, self-control, and in *your* self-control, perseverance, and in *your* perseverance, godliness, ⁷ and in *your* godliness, brotherly kindness, and in *your* brotherly kindness, love.

2 Peter 3:17-18 LSB

¹⁷ You therefore, beloved, knowing this beforehand, be on your guard lest you, having been carried away by the error of unprincipled men, fall from your own steadfastness, ¹⁸ but grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The Author of 2 Peter

Simon Peter

<u>2 Peter 1:1</u> (NASB95) ¹ <u>Simon Peter, a bond-servant and apostle of Jesus Christ,</u> **To** those who have received a faith of the same kind as ours, by the righteousness of our God and Savior, Jesus Christ:

Peter's background

John 1:40–42 (LSB) ⁴⁰ One of the two who heard John *speak* and followed Him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. ⁴¹ He first found his own brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which translated means Christ). ⁴² He brought him to Jesus. When Jesus looked at him, <u>He said</u>, "You are Simon the son of John; you shall be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter).

Matthew 16:22–23 (LSB) ²² And Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him, saying, "God forbid *it*, Lord! This shall never happen to You." ²³ But He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to Me; for you are not setting your mind on God's interests, but man's."

Matthew 26:40 (LSB) ⁴⁰ And He came to the disciples and found them sleeping, and said to Peter, "So, you *men* could not keep watch with Me for one hour?

<u>Matthew 26:34</u> (LSB) ³⁴ Jesus said to him, <u>"Truly I say to you that this very night, before a rooster crows, you will deny Me three times."</u>

Mark 14:70–72 (LSB) ⁷⁰ But again he was denying it. And after a little while the bystanders were again saying to Peter, "Surely you are *one* of them, for you are also a Galilean." ⁷¹ But he began to curse and swear, "I do not know this man you are talking about!" ⁷² And immediately a rooster crowed a second time. And Peter remembered how Jesus had said the statement to him, "Before a rooster crows twice, you will deny Me three times." And throwing himself down, he *began to* cry.

John 18:10–11 (LSB) ¹⁰ Simon Peter then, having a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's slave, and cut off his right ear; and the slave's name was Malchus. ¹¹ So Jesus said to Peter, "Put the sword into the sheath; the cup which the Father has given Me, shall I not drink it?"

<u>Luke 22:50–51</u> (LSB) ⁵⁰ And one of them struck the slave of the high priest and cut off his right ear. ⁵¹ But Jesus answered and said, "Stop! No more of this." And He touched his ear and healed him.

Matthew 16:24–25 (LSB) ²⁴ Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me. ²⁵ "For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it; but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it.

Peter's Pity Party

<u>John 20:1</u> (LSB) ¹ Now on the first *day* of the week, Mary Magdalene came early to the tomb, while it was still dark, and saw the stone *already* taken away from the tomb.

John 20:16 (LSB) ¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to Him in Hebrew, "Rabboni!" (which means, Teacher).

<u>Luke 24:34</u> (LSB) ³⁴ who were saying, "The Lord has really risen and has appeared to Simon."

Peter's Lowest Point

John 21:3–7 (LSB) ³ Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will also come with you." They went out and got into the boat; and that night they caught nothing. ⁴ But when the day was now breaking, Jesus stood on the beach; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. ⁵ So Jesus said to them, "Children, do you have any fish?" They answered Him, "No." ⁶ And He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat and you will find some." So they cast, and then they were not able to haul it in because of the great number of fish.

⁷ Therefore that disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." So when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put his outer garment on (for he was stripped *for work*), and cast himself into the sea.

<u>Matthew 28:7</u> (LSB) ⁷ "And go quickly and tell His disciples that He has risen from the dead; and behold, He is going ahead of you into Galilee, there you will see Him; behold, I have told you."

<u>Matthew 16:16</u> (LSB) ¹⁶ And Simon Peter answered and said, <u>"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."</u>

Matthew 16:17 (LSB) ¹⁷ And Jesus answered and said to him, "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah, because flesh and blood did not reveal *this* to you, but My Father who is in heaven.

Matthew 16:13–15 (LSB) ¹³ Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, He was asking His disciples, saying, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" ¹⁴ And they said, "Some *say* John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; but still others, Jeremiah, or one of the prophets." ¹⁵ He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?"

Matthew 16:18–19 (LSB) ¹⁸ "And I also say to you that you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build My church; and the gates of Hades will not overpower it. ¹⁹ "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever you bind on

earth shall have been bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall have been loosed in heaven."

<u>Jonah 1:2–3</u> (LSB) ² "Arise, go to Nineveh, the great city, and call out against it, for their evil has come up before Me." ³ <u>Yet Jonah arose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of Yahweh. So he went down to Joppa,</u> found a ship which was going to Tarshish, and paid its fare and went down into it to go with them to Tarshish from the presence of Yahweh.

<u>Jonah 1:4</u> (LSB) ⁴ But Yahweh hurled a great wind on the sea, and there was a great storm on the sea so that the ship gave thought to breaking apart.

<u>Jonah 1:12</u> (LSB) ¹² So he said to them, "Lift me up and hurl me into the sea. Then the sea will become quiet for you, for I know that on account of me this great storm *has come* upon you."

<u>Jonah 1:15</u> (LSB) ¹⁵ So they lifted Jonah up and hurled him into the sea, and the sea stood still from its raging.

<u>Jonah 2:2</u> (LSB) ² and he said, "I called out of my distress to Yahweh, And He answered me. I cried for help from the belly of Sheol; You heard my voice.

John 21:15–17 (LSB) ¹⁵ So when they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me more than these?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Tend My lambs." ¹⁶ He said to him again a second time, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Shepherd My sheep." ¹⁷ He said to him the third time, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me?" Peter was grieved because He said to him the third time, "Do you love Me?" And he said to Him, "Lord, You know all things; You know that I love You." Jesus said to him, "Tend My sheep.

Matthew 16:19 (LSB) ¹⁹ "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever you bind on earth shall have been bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall have been loosed in heaven."

Peter takes his stand

Acts 2:14–16 (LSB) ¹⁴ But Peter, taking his stand with the eleven, raised his voice and declared to them: "Men of Judea and all you who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you and give heed to my words. ¹⁵ "For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is the third hour of the day; ¹⁶ but this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

Jonah 4:2 (LSB) ² And he prayed to Yahweh and said, "Ah! O Yahweh, was not this my word *to myself* while I was still in my *own* land? Therefore I went ahead to flee to Tarshish, for I knew that <u>You are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abundant in lovingkindness, and one who relents concerning evil.</u>

Acts 10:5–6 (LSB) ⁵ "Now send *some* men to Joppa and summon a man *named* Simon, who is also called Peter; ⁶ he is lodging with a tanner *named* Simon, whose house is by the sea."
