#### Sermon Text

#### 2 Peter 1:2-7 LSB

<sup>2</sup> Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the full knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord; <sup>3</sup> seeing that His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the full knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence. <sup>4</sup> For by these He has granted to us His precious and magnificent promises, so that by them you may become partakers of *the* divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world by lust. <sup>5</sup> Now for this very reason also, applying all diligence, in your faith supply moral excellence, and in *your* moral excellence, knowledge, <sup>6</sup> and in *your* knowledge, self-control, and in *your* self-control, perseverance, and in *your* perseverance, godliness, <sup>7</sup> and in *your* godliness, brotherly kindness, and in *your* brotherly kindness, love.

# **Proposition and Outline**

As we approach 2024 and beyond with all the possibilities, the Apostle Peter gives three litmus tests for whether your faith is <u>true and growing</u>. You must have:

- 1. A Faith that Advances in Knowledge (2 Pet 1:2-4)
- 2. A Faith that Abounds in Love (2 Pet 1:5-11)
- 3. A Faith that Affirms God's Grace (2 Pet 3:17-18)

#### Review

#### The Author of 2 Peter

John 1:40–42 (LSB) <sup>40</sup> One of the two who heard John *speak* and followed Him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. <sup>41</sup> He first found his own brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which translated means Christ). <sup>42</sup> He brought him to Jesus. When Jesus looked at him, He said, "You are Simon the son of John; you shall be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter).

Matthew 16:16 (LSB) <sup>16</sup> And Simon Peter answered and said, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Matthew 16:21 (LSB) <sup>21</sup> From that time Jesus began to show His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised up on the third day.

Matthew 16:23 (LSB) <sup>23</sup> But He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to Me; for you are not setting your mind on God's interests, but man's."

<u>Luke 22:61–62</u> (LSB) <sup>61</sup> And the Lord turned and looked at Peter. And Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how He had told him, "Before a rooster crows today, you will deny Me three times." <sup>62</sup> And he went out and cried bitterly.

John 21:17 (LSB) <sup>17</sup> He said to him the third time, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me?" Peter was grieved because He said to him the third time, "Do you love Me?" And he said to Him, "Lord, You know all things; You know that I love You." Jesus said to him, "Tend My sheep.

Acts 2:14 (LSB) <sup>14</sup> But Peter, taking his stand with the eleven, raised his voice and declared to them: "Men of Judea and all you who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you and give heed to my words.

Acts 10:34–35 (LSB) <sup>34</sup> And opening his mouth, Peter said: "I most truly comprehend *now* that God is not one to show partiality, <sup>35</sup> but in every nation the one who fears Him and does righteousness is welcome to Him.

#### The Context of 2 Peter

#### Peter's Audience

<u>2 Peter 1:1</u> (LSB) <sup>1</sup> Simeon Peter, a slave and apostle of Jesus Christ, **To** <u>those</u> who have received the same kind of faith as ours, by the righteousness of our <u>God and Savior, Jesus Christ:</u>

<u>2 Peter 3:1</u> (LSB) <sup>1</sup> This is now, beloved, the second letter I am writing to you in which I am stirring up your sincere mind by way of reminder,

<u>1 Peter 1:1–2</u> (LSB) <sup>1</sup> Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, <u>To those who reside as exiles</u>, scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia,

who are chosen<sup>2</sup> according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, by the sanctifying work of the Spirit, to the obedience of Jesus Christ and the sprinkling of His blood: May grace and peace be multiplied to you.

<u>1 Peter 1:4</u> (LSB) <sup>4</sup> to *obtain* an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and unfading, having been kept in heaven for you,

<u>1 Peter 1:6–7</u> (LSB) <sup>6</sup> In this you greatly rejoice, even though now for a little while, if necessary, <u>you have been grieved by various trials</u>, <sup>7</sup> so that the proof of your faith, *being* more precious than gold which is perishable, <u>even though tested by fire</u>, may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.

#### Peter's Main Point

<u>1 Peter 5:8</u> (LSB) <sup>8</sup> Be of sober *spirit*, be watchful. Your adversary, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour.

#### The Church's One Foundation - Verse 3

Though with a scornful wonder, men see her sore oppressed, by schisms rent asunder, by heresies distressed, yet saints their watch are keeping, their cry goes up, "How long?" and soon the night of weeping shall be the morn of song!

# You must have a Faith that <u>Advances in Knowledge (2</u> Peter 1:2-4)

<u>2 Peter 1:2</u> (LSB) <sup>2</sup> <u>Grace and peace be multiplied to you</u> in the full knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord;

<u>Ephesians 2:8–9</u> (LSB) <sup>8</sup> For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this not of yourselves, *it is* the gift of God; <sup>9</sup> not of works, so that no one may boast.

#### Peter's confidence - multiplied grace and peace! (2 Peter 1:2)

<u>2 Peter 1:2</u> (LSB) <sup>2</sup> Grace and peace be multiplied to you <u>in the full knowledge</u> <u>of God and of Jesus our Lord;</u>

# What is true knowledge?

<u>1 Timothy 2:4</u> (LSB) <sup>4</sup> who desires all men to be saved and to come to the full knowledge of the truth.

<u>2 Timothy 2:25</u> (LSB) <sup>25</sup> with gentleness correcting those who are in opposition, if perhaps God may give them repentance <u>leading to the full knowledge of the truth</u>,

<u>2 Timothy 3:7</u> (LSB) <sup>7</sup> always learning and never able to come to the full knowledge of the truth.

<u>Titus 1:1</u> (LSB) <sup>1</sup> Paul, a slave of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ, for the faith of God's elect and <u>the full knowledge of the truth</u> which is according to godliness,

Hebrews 10:26 (LSB) <sup>26</sup> For if we go on sinning willfully after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins,

Ephesians 1:13 (LSB) <sup>13</sup> In Him, you also, after listening to the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation—having also believed, you were sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit of promise,

#### What is false knowledge?

<u>1 Thessalonians 5:8</u> (LSB) <sup>8</sup> But since we are of *the* day, let us be sober, having put on the breastplate of faith and love, and <u>as a helmet, the hope of salvation.</u>

# Peter's confirmation - we have been granted everything we need (2 Peter 1:3)

<u>2 Peter 1:3</u> (LSB) <sup>3</sup> <u>seeing that His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness</u>, through the full knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence.

<u>1 Peter 1:2</u> (LSB) <sup>2</sup> <u>according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, by the sanctifying work of the Spirit,</u> to the obedience of Jesus Christ and the sprinkling of His blood: May grace and peace be multiplied to you.

<u>2 Corinthians 9:8</u> (LSB) <sup>8</sup> And God is able to make every grace abound to you, so that in everything at every time having every sufficiency, you may have an abundance for every good deed;

<u>1 Timothy 1:12–14</u> (LSB) <sup>12</sup> I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because He regarded me faithful, putting me into service, <sup>13</sup> even though I was formerly a blasphemer and a persecutor and a violent aggressor. Yet I was shown mercy because I acted ignorantly in unbelief; <sup>14</sup> and the grace of our Lord was more than abundant, with the faith and love which are in Christ Jesus.

<u>1 Timothy 1:15</u> (LSB) <sup>15</sup> It is a trustworthy saying and deserving full acceptance: that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, <u>among whom I am</u> foremost.

<u>2 Peter 1:3</u> (LSB) <sup>3</sup> <u>seeing that His divine power</u> has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the full knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence.

#### His divine power confirms it!

<u>Psalm 24:1</u> (LSB) <sup>1</sup> The earth is Yahweh's, as well as its fullness, The world, and those who dwell in it.

Genesis 1:1 (LSB) <sup>1</sup> In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

<u>Psalm 19:1</u> (LSB) <sup>1</sup> The heavens are telling of the glory of God; And the expanse is declaring the work of His hands.

Ephesians 1:18–21 (LSB) <sup>18</sup> so that you—the eyes of your heart having been enlightened—will know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, <sup>19</sup> and what is the surpassing greatness of His power toward us who believe according to the working of the might of His strength, <sup>20</sup> which He worked in Christ, by raising Him from the dead and seating Him at His right hand in the heavenly *places*, <sup>21</sup> far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come.

<u>2 Peter 1:3</u> (LSB) <sup>3</sup> seeing that His divine power <u>has granted to us everything</u> <u>pertaining to life and godliness</u>, through the full knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence.

#### What's the catch?

Ephesians 1:3 (LSB) <sup>3</sup> Blessed *be* the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who <u>has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly *places* in Christ,</u>

<u>Luke 16:11</u> (LSB) <sup>11</sup> "Therefore if you have not been faithful in the *use of* unrighteous wealth, who will entrust the true *riches* to you?

Matthew 6:19–21 (LSB) <sup>19</sup> "Do not store up for yourselves <u>treasures on earth</u>, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. <sup>20</sup> "<u>But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven</u>, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal; <sup>21</sup> for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

#### Connecting to Peter's Main Point

<u>2 Peter 2:1–3</u> (LSB) <sup>1</sup> But false prophets also arose among the people, just as there will also be <u>false teachers among you</u>, <u>who will secretly introduce</u> <u>destructive heresies</u>, <u>even denying the Master who bought them</u>, <u>bringing swift destruction upon themselves</u>. <sup>2</sup> And many will follow their sensuality, and <u>because of them the way of the truth will be maligned</u>. <sup>3</sup> And in <u>their greed they will exploit you with false words</u>, their judgment from long ago is not idle, and their destruction is not asleep.

# What have we been given?

<u>2 Peter 1:3</u> (LSB) <sup>3</sup> seeing that His divine power has granted to us everything <u>pertaining to life and godliness</u>, through the full knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence.

As a Christian, by grace, God has given you -

• Faith (Eph 2:8-9)

<u>Ephesians 2:8–9</u> (LSB) <sup>8</sup> For by grace you have been saved <u>through faith</u>, and this not of yourselves, *it is* the gift of God; <sup>9</sup> not of works, so that no one may boast.

#### Forgiveness (<u>Eph 1:7</u>)

<u>Ephesians 1:7</u> (LSB) <sup>7</sup> In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our transgressions, according to the riches of His grace

- The Holy Spirit (<u>Eph 1:13-14</u>)
- An Inheritance

Ephesians 1:13–14 (LSB) <sup>13</sup> In Him, you also, after listening to the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation—having also believed, you were sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit of promise, <sup>14</sup> who is given as a pledge of our inheritance, unto the redemption of *God's own* possession, to the praise of His glory.

• The Fruit of the Spirit (Gal 5:22-23)

<u>Galatians 5:22–23</u> (LSB) <sup>22</sup> But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, <sup>23</sup> gentleness, self-control. Against such things there is no law.

Gifts of the Spirit (Eph 4:7-8)

Ephesians 4:7–8 (LSB) <sup>7</sup> But to each one of us grace was given according to the measure of Christ's gift. <sup>8</sup> Therefore it says, "WHEN HE ASCENDED ON HIGH, HE LED CAPTIVE A HOST OF CAPTIVES, *And* HE GAVE GIFTS TO MEN."

Every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places (Eph 1:3)

Ephesians 1:3 (LSB) <sup>3</sup> Blessed *be* the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly *places* in Christ,

Christ's righteousness (<u>2 Cor 5:21</u>)

<u>2 Corinthians 5:21</u> (LSB) <sup>21</sup> He made Him who knew no sin *to be* sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

#### The Church for your protection and fellowship (Eph 5:25; Acts 20:28)

Acts 20:28 (LSB) <sup>28</sup> "Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood.

<u>Ephesians 5:25</u> (LSB) <sup>25</sup> Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself up for her,

Ephesians 1:4 (LSB) <sup>4</sup> just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we would be holy and blameless before Him in love,

#### How do we unlock these gifts?

<u>2 Peter 1:3</u> (LSB) <sup>3</sup> seeing that His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, <u>through the full knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence.</u>

Matthew 16:24 (LSB) <sup>24</sup> Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me.

### Peter reiterates the magnificent promises!

<u>2 Peter 1:4</u> (LSB) <sup>4</sup> <u>For by these He has granted to us His precious and magnificent promises, so that by them you may become partakers of *the* divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world by lust.</u>

<u>Ephesians 1:5–6</u> (LSB) <sup>5</sup> <u>by predestining us to adoption as sons through Jesus</u> <u>Christ to Himself</u>, according to the good pleasure of His will, <sup>6</sup> to the praise of the glory of His grace, which He graciously bestowed on us in the Beloved.

<u>2 Peter 1:4</u> (LSB) <sup>4</sup> For by these He has granted to us His precious and magnificent promises, so that by them you may become partakers of *the* divine nature, <u>having escaped the corruption that is in the world by lust.</u>

# Having a faith that advances?

Matthew 7:13 (LSB) <sup>13</sup> "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is broad that leads to destruction, and there are many who enter through it.

#### Applying these truths as a church

Hebrews 12:1–3 (LSB) <sup>1</sup> Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, laying aside every weight and the sin which so easily entangles us, let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, <sup>2</sup> fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. <sup>3</sup> For consider Him who has endured such hostility by sinners against Himself, so that you will not grow weary, fainting in heart.
