2 Peter 1:2-7 LSB

² Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the full knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord; ³ seeing that His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the full knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence. ⁴ For by these He has granted to us His precious and magnificent promises, so that by them you may become partakers of *the* divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world by lust. ⁵ Now for this very reason also, applying all diligence, in your faith supply moral excellence, and in *your* moral excellence, knowledge, ⁶ and in *your* knowledge, self-control, and in *your* self-control, perseverance, and in *your* perseverance, godliness, ⁷ and in *your* godliness, brotherly kindness, and in *your* brotherly kindness, love.

As we approach 2024 and beyond with all the possibilities, the Apostle Peter gives three litmus tests for whether your faith is <u>true and growing</u>. You must have:

- 1. A Faith that Advances in Knowledge (2 Pet 1:2-4) [Review]
- 2. A Faith that Abounds in Love (2 Pet 1:5-11)
- 3. A Faith that Affirms God's Grace (2 Pet 3:17-18)

Review

The Author of 2 Peter

<u>Luke 22:61–62</u> (LSB) ⁶¹ And the Lord turned and looked at Peter. And Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how He had told him, "Before a rooster crows today, you will deny Me three times." ⁶² And he went out and cried bitterly.

Acts 2:14 (LSB) ¹⁴ But Peter, <u>taking his stand with the eleven</u>, <u>raised his voice</u> and <u>declared to them</u>: "Men of Judea and all you who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you and give heed to my words.

Acts 10:25–28 (LSB) ²⁵ And when Peter entered, Cornelius met him, and fell at his feet and worshiped *him*. ²⁶ But Peter raised him up, saying, "Stand up; I too am *just* a man." ²⁷ As he talked with him, he entered and found many people assembled. ²⁸ And he said to them, "You yourselves know how unlawful it is for a man who is a Jew to associate with a foreigner or to visit him; and *yet* God has shown me that I should not call any man defiled or unclean.

The Audience of 2 Peter

<u>2 Peter 3:1</u> (LSB) ¹ This is now, beloved, the second letter I am writing to you in which I am stirring up your sincere mind by way of reminder,

<u>1 Peter 1:1–2</u> (LSB) ¹ Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, **To** those who reside as exiles, scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, who are chosen ² according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, by the sanctifying work of the Spirit, to the obedience of Jesus Christ and the sprinkling of His blood: May grace and peace be multiplied to you.

You must have a Faith that Advances in Knowledge (2 Peter 1:2-4)

<u>2 Peter 1:2</u> (LSB) ² Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the full knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord;

<u>2 Peter 1:2</u> (LSB) ² <u>Grace and peace be multiplied to you</u> in the full knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord;

<u>2 Peter 1:3</u> (LSB) ³ seeing that <u>His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness,</u> through the full knowledge of Him <u>who called</u> us by His own glory and excellence.

Ephesians 1:3 (LSB) ³ Blessed *be* the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly *places* in Christ,

Ephesians 1:13–14 (LSB) ¹³ In Him, you also, after listening to the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation—having also believed, you were sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit of promise, ¹⁴ who is given as a pledge of our inheritance, unto the redemption of *God's own* possession, to the praise of His glory.

You must have a Faith that <u>Abounds in Love (2 Peter 1:5-7)</u>

<u>2 Peter 1:5</u> (LSB) ⁵ <u>Now for this very reason also, applying all diligence</u>, in your faith supply moral excellence, and in *your* moral excellence, knowledge,

We've been given everything! What more do we need to do?

Perhaps the greatest gift that Greece, and especially Athens, gave to the world was the plays and dramatic works of men like Aeschylus, Sophocles and Euripides, which are still among its most cherished possessions. All these plays needed large choruses and were, therefore, very expensive to produce. In the great days of Athens, there were <u>public-spirited citizens who voluntarily took on the duty, at their own expense, of collecting, maintaining, training and equipping</u> such choruses. It was at the major religious festivals that these plays were produced. For instance, at the city Dionysia, three tragedies, five comedies and five wild and riotous choruses were produced. Men had to be found to provide the choruses for them all, a duty which could cost as much as 3,000 drachmae. The men who undertook these duties out of their own pocket

and out of love for their city were called chorēgoi, and chorēgein was the verb used for undertaking such a duty. ~ William Barclay

The foundation is our faith in Christ!

<u>2 Peter 1:5</u> (LSB) ⁵ Now for this very reason also, applying all diligence, <u>in your faith supply moral excellence</u>, and in *your* moral excellence, knowledge,

Our faith will abound in love when we supply Moral Excellence!

<u>2 Peter 1:5</u> (ESV) ⁵ For this very reason, make every effort <u>to supplement your</u> <u>faith with virtue</u>, and virtue with knowledge,

God is a hope of courage (aretē), not an excuse for cowardice. ~ Plutarch

Faith must lead not to the retreat and seclusion of the cloister and the hermit's cell, but to a life effective in the service of God and other people; and it must produce the courage always to show whose life it is and whom it serves. ~ William Barclay

Philippians 3:14 (LSB) ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

Our faith will abound in love when we supply Knowledge!

<u>2 Peter 1:5</u> (LSB) ⁵ Now for this very reason also, applying all diligence, in your faith supply moral excellence, and in *your* moral excellence, <u>knowledge</u>,

This knowledge [gnosis] which enables people to decide to take the right course and to act honourably and efficiently in the day-today circumstances of life. So, to faith must be added courage and effectiveness; to courage and effectiveness must be added the practical wisdom to deal with life. ~ William Barclay

Our faith will abound in love when we supply Self-Control!

<u>2 Peter 1:6</u> (LSB) ⁶ and <u>in your knowledge, self-control</u>, and in *your* self-control, perseverance, and in *your* perseverance, godliness,

Aristotle distinguishes four states in life. There is [a state] in which passion has been put entirely under the control of reason; we might call it perfect self-discipline. There is [another state] which is the precise opposite; it is the state in which reason is entirely suppressed by passion; we might call it unrestrained lust. In between these two states, there is [another state], in which reason fights but passion prevails; we might call it lack of self-restraint. There is [this particular state], in which reason fights against passion and prevails; we call it self-control.

[Self-Control] does not contemplate a situation in which a person is stripped of all passion; it envisages a situation in which passions remain, but are under perfect control and so become servants, not tyrants. ~ William Barclay

Our faith will abound in love when we supply Perseverance!

<u>2 Peter 1:6</u> (LSB) ⁶ and in *your* knowledge, self-control, and <u>in *your* self-control, perseverance, and in *your* perseverance, godliness,</u>

<u>2 Peter 1:6</u> (HCSB) ⁶ knowledge with self-control, self-control with endurance, endurance with godliness,

<u>2 Peter 1:6</u> (ESV) ⁶ and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with steadfastness, and steadfastness with godliness,

Didymus of Alexandria, writing in the third century on the attitude of Job, says: 'It is not that the righteous man must be without feeling, although he must patiently bear the things which afflict him; but it is true virtue when a man deeply feels the things he toils against, but nevertheless despises sorrows for the sake of God.'

Michael Green has said, "The Christianity of such a man is like the steady burning of a star rather than the ephemeral brilliance and speedy eclipse of a meteor." Everybody has a plan until they get punched in the face. ~ Mike Tyson

Chrysostom calls perseverance, "the queen of virtues, the foundation of right actions, peace in war, calm in tempest, security in plots, and neither the violence of man nor the powers of the evil one can injure it. It is the quality which keeps a man on his feet with his face to the wind. It is the virtue which can transmute the hardest trial into glory, because beyond the pain it sees the goal

Our faith will abound in love when we supply **Godliness!**

<u>2 Peter 1:6</u> (LSB) ⁶ and in *your* knowledge, self-control, and in *your* self-control, perseverance, <u>and in *your* perseverance</u>, <u>godliness</u>,

<u>Psalm 16:8</u> (LSB) ⁸ I have set Yahweh continually before me; Because He is at my right hand, I will not be shaken.

<u>1 Timothy 4:8</u> (LSB) ⁸ for bodily training is only of little profit, but godliness is profitable for all things, since it holds promise for the present life and *also* for the *life* to come.

True Christians pursue practical awareness of God in every detail of life. They are characterized by deep reverence for God, which leads to courageous, steadfast, joyful, self-control under temptation, built on spiritual discernment in the pursuit of moral excellence. It's a marvelous fabric woven here. ~ John MacArthur

Godliness (eusebeia) is the nearest Greek word for religion; and, when we begin to define it, we see the intensely practical character of the Christian religion. When people become Christians, they acknowledge a double duty, to God and to their neighbours.

Our faith will abound in love when we supply **Brotherly Kindness!**

<u>2 Peter 1:7</u> (LSB) ⁷ <u>and in your godliness, brotherly kindness</u>, and in your brotherly kindness, love.

How can he who has to teach mankind run to get something in which to heat the water to give the baby his bath?' ~ Epictetus

<u>1 John 4:20</u> (LSB) ²⁰ If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for the one who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen.

Matthew 22:36–40 (LSB)³⁶ "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" ³⁷ And He said to him, "<u>YOU SHALL LOVE THE LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART, AND WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND.</u>" ³⁸ "This is the great and foremost commandment. ³⁹ "And the second is like it, <u>'YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF.</u>" ⁴⁰ "On these two commandments hang the whole Law and the Prophets."

Our faith will abound in love when we supply Sacrificial Love!

<u>2 Peter 1:7</u> (LSB) ⁷ and in *your* godliness, brotherly kindness, <u>and in *your* brotherly kindness, love.</u>

This is the highest and purest and noblest love, which will then be reflected in kindness to other Christians, rising out of a deep reverence for our beloved God, leading to a courageous, steadfast, joyful, self-control under temptation, built on spiritual discernment and the consuming compelling pursuit to be like Christ. It's just a big circle. And faith is the foundation for the whole thing, and love is the culmination. ~ John MacArthur

You must have a Faith that <u>Affirms God's Grace</u> (<u>2 Peter</u> <u>3:17-18</u>)

<u>2 Peter 3:17–18</u> (LSB) ¹⁷ You therefore, beloved, knowing this beforehand, be on your guard lest you, having been carried away by the error of unprincipled men, fall from your own steadfastness, ¹⁸ but grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him *be* the glory, both now and to the day of eternity. Amen.

Philippians 1:6 (LSB) ⁶ For I am confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus.
