James 5:1–6 (LSB) <sup>1</sup> Come now, you rich, cry, howling over your miseries which are coming upon you. <sup>2</sup> Your riches have rotted and your garments have become moth-eaten. <sup>3</sup> Your gold and your silver have rusted, and their corrosion will be a witness against you and will consume your flesh like fire. You have stored up *such* treasure in the last days! <sup>4</sup> Behold, the pay of the laborers who mowed your fields—that which has been withheld by you—cries out *against you*; and the outcries of those who did the harvesting have reached the ears of the Lord of Sabaoth. <sup>5</sup> You have lived luxuriously on the earth and lived in self-indulgence. Matthew 5:25–26 (LSB) <sup>25</sup> "Make friends quickly with your opponent at law while you are with him on the way, so that your opponent may not hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the officer, and you be thrown into prison. <sup>26</sup> "Truly I say to you, you will not come out of there until you have paid up the last quadrans.

### Thou Shalt Not Lust! (Matt 5:27-30)

### Jesus gives the letter of the command (Matt 5:27)

Matthew 5:27 (LSB) <sup>27</sup> "You have heard that it was said, 'You SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY';

<u>Matthew 5:28</u> (LSB) <sup>28</sup> but I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman to lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

<u>2 Samuel 11:2–3</u> (LSB) <sup>2</sup> Now when evening came David arose from his bed and walked around on the roof of the king's house, and from the roof he saw a woman bathing; and the woman was very beautiful in appearance. <sup>3</sup> So David sent and inquired about the woman. And one said, "Is this not Bathsheba, the daughter of Eliam, the wife of Uriah the Hittite?"

Matthew 5:31 (LSB) <sup>31</sup> "Now it was said, 'Whoever sends his wife away, LET HIM GIVE HER A CERTIFICATE OF DIVORCE';

# The background to Jesus's quote in <a href="Matthew5:31"><u>Matthew 5:31</u></a>

#### Deuteronomy 24:1-4

<u>Deuteronomy 24:1</u> (LSB) <sup>1</sup> "If a man takes a wife and marries her, and it happens that she finds no favor in his eyes because he has found some indecency in her, and he writes her a certificate of divorce and puts *it* in her hand and sends her out from his house,

#### **Leviticus 20:10 LSB**

<sup>10</sup> 'If *there is* a man who commits adultery with another man's wife, one who commits adultery with his friend's wife, the adulterer and the adulteress shall surely be put to death.

#### Deuteronomy 22:22-24 LSB

<sup>22</sup> "If a man is found lying with a married woman, then both of them shall die, the man who lay with the woman, and the woman; thus you shall purge the evil from Israel. <sup>23</sup> "If there is a girl who is a virgin engaged to a man, and *another* man finds her in the city and lies with her, <sup>24</sup> then you shall bring them both out to the gate of that city, and you shall stone them, and they will die; the girl, because she did not cry out in the city, and the man, because he has violated his neighbor's wife. Thus you shall purge the evil from among you.

Deuteronomy 24:2–4 (LSB) <sup>2</sup> and she goes out of his house and goes and becomes another man's *wife*, <sup>3</sup> and if the latter husband turns against her and writes her a certificate of divorce and puts *it* in her hand and sends her out of his house, or if the latter husband dies who took her to be his wife, <sup>4</sup> *then* her former husband who sent her away is not allowed to take her again to be his

wife, since she has been defiled; for that is an abomination before Yahweh, and you shall not bring sin on the land which Yahweh your God gives you as an inheritance.

#### Israel twists our Lord's intent

#### Matt 19:1-9

<u>Matthew 19:3–6</u> (LSB) <sup>3</sup> And *some* Pharisees came to Jesus, testing Him and saying, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any reason at all?"

<sup>4</sup> And He answered and said, "Have you not read that He who created *them* from the beginning MADE THEM MALE AND FEMALE, <sup>5</sup> and said, 'FOR THIS REASON A MAN SHALL LEAVE HIS FATHER AND MOTHER AND BE JOINED TO HIS WIFE, AND THE TWO SHALL BECOME ONE FLESH'?

<sup>6</sup> "So they are no longer two, but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let no man separate."

<sup>8</sup> He said to them, "Because of your hardness of heart Moses permitted you to divorce your wives; <u>but from the beginning</u> it has not been this way.

God's permission for divorce was but another accommodation of His grace to human sin. ~ John MacArthur

<u>Matthew 19:9</u> (LSB) <sup>9</sup> "And I say to you, whoever divorces his wife, except for sexual immorality, and marries another woman commits adultery."

### God's original intent for marriage - Gen 1 & 2

#### Genesis 1

Genesis 1:1 (LSB) <sup>1</sup> In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

Psalm 24:1 (LSB) <sup>1</sup> The earth is Yahweh's, as well as its fullness, The world, and those who dwell in it.

Romans 1:18 (LSB) <sup>18</sup> For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness,

<u>Proverbs 3:19</u> (LSB) <sup>19</sup> Yahweh by wisdom founded the earth, By discernment He established the heavens.

Genesis 1:26–28 (LSB) <sup>26</sup> Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness, so that they will have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the sky and over the cattle and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." <sup>27</sup> And God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created him; <u>male and female He</u> created them.

<sup>28</sup> God blessed them, and God said to them, <u>"Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth</u>, and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the sky and over every living thing that creeps on the earth."

<u>Genesis 1:31</u> (LSB) <sup>31</sup> And God saw all that He had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

#### Genesis 2

Genesis 2:1–4 (LSB) <sup>1</sup> Thus the heavens and the earth were completed, and all their hosts. <sup>2</sup> And on the seventh day God completed His work which He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done. <sup>3</sup> Then God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because on it He rested from all His work which God had created in making *it*. <sup>4</sup> These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created, in the day that Yahweh God made earth and heaven.

Genesis 2:5–6 (LSB) <sup>5</sup> Now no shrub of the field was yet in the earth, and no plant of the field had yet grown, for Yahweh God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was no man to cultivate the ground. <sup>6</sup> But a stream would rise from the earth and water the whole surface of the ground.

Genesis 2:7–8 (LSB) <sup>7</sup> Then Yahweh God formed man of dust from the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and so the man became a living

being. <sup>8</sup> And Yahweh God planted a garden in Eden, toward the east; and there He placed the man whom He had formed.

Genesis 2:9 (LSB) <sup>9</sup> And out of the ground Yahweh God caused to grow every tree that is desirable in appearance and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

Genesis 2:15 (LSB) <sup>15</sup> Then Yahweh God took the man and set him in the garden of Eden to cultivate it and keep it.

Genesis 2:16–17 (LSB) <sup>16</sup> And Yahweh God commanded the man, saying, "From any tree of the garden you may surely eat; <sup>17</sup> but from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, you shall not eat from it; for in the day that you eat from it you will surely die."

<u>Genesis 2:18</u> (LSB) <sup>18</sup> Then Yahweh God said, "<u>It is not good</u> for the man to be alone; I will make him a helper suitable for him."

Genesis 2:19–20 (LSB) <sup>19</sup> And out of the ground Yahweh God had formed every beast of the field and every bird of the sky, and He brought *each* to the man to see what he would call it; and whatever the man called a living creature, that was its name. <sup>20</sup> And the man gave names to all the cattle and to the birds of the sky and to every beast of the field; but for Adam there was not found a helper suitable for him.

Genesis 2:21–25 (LSB)<sup>21</sup> So Yahweh God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then He took one of his ribs and closed up the flesh at that place. <sup>22</sup> And Yahweh God fashioned the rib, which He had taken from the man, into a woman, and He brought her to the man.

<sup>23</sup> Then the man said, "This one finally is bone of my bones, And flesh of my flesh; This one shall be called Woman, Because this one was taken out of Man."

<sup>24</sup> Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother, and cleave to his wife; and they shall become one flesh.

As God designed it, marriage is to be the welding of two people together into one unit, the blending of two minds, two wills, two sets of emotions, two spirits. ~ John MacArthur

<u>Matthew 19:6</u> (LSB) <sup>6</sup> "So they are no longer two, but one flesh. <u>What therefore</u> God has joined together, let no man separate."

### The Fall - Genesis 3

Genesis 2:16–17 (LSB) And Yahweh God commanded the man, saying, "From any tree of the garden you may surely eat; but from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, you shall not eat from it; for in the day that you eat from it you will surely die."

Genesis 3:6 (LSB) Then the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was desirable to make *one* wise, so she took from its fruit and ate; and she gave also to her husband with her, and he ate.

Romans 5:12 (LSB) Therefore, just as through one man sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, because all sinned—

Genesis 3:16 (LSB) To the woman He said, "I will greatly multiply Your pain and conception, In pain you will bear children; Your desire will be for your husband, And he will rule over you."
