### **Read: Romans Chapter 4**

The promises of God are received by faith. Righteousness does not come through the law. Some people Paul wrote to were tempted to put their confidence in the religious actions, like circumcision. Good deeds can't save us. We are redeemed, which means bought back, through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Abraham is an example of someone who believed God and righteousness was credited to Him. We have a rich spiritual legacy through the patriarch. The gospel doesn't change. The grace of God, an undeserved gift, truly is amazing. Even when it looks like there is no hope, we have the certain and infinite hope of Jesus and Scripture. God does not lie or deceive us.
