Synopsis:

Three Directives that Reveal the Future of Israel and the End of the World

- 1. The Person Sent by God (9:20–23)
- 2. The Prophecy Set Forth by God (9:24)
- 3. The Period of Time Secured by God (9:25–27)

Questions:

Warm Up:

- 1. What is one way that the sermon encouraged, exhorted, challenged, or corrected you?
- 2. Why would Pastor Scott characterize this section as one of the most important prophecies in the Bible?

Discussion:

- 1. Why was Israel punished for seventy years? What happened to the nation for those seventy years?
- 2. What does God do immediately in response to Daniel's speaking, praying, confessing, and presenting? Who is Gabriel and why has he come? (Consider Luke 1:19)
- 3. What does seventy weeks mean in verse 24?
- 4. What are the three main views surrounding this topic that Pastor Scott explained?

Application:

- 1. How can you be encouraged by the fact that the Lord will one day bring in everlasting righteousness?
- 2. How can you cultivate a Berean heart this week in studying God's Word even when it gets complicated?
- 3. How can the history of Israel lead you to gratitude for the grace and work of Christ?
