## Synopsis:

Ch.1 Blueprint for the Conduct of Leaders

- 1. Home and Family life
- 2. His Personal Character
  - a. 5 Deadly Characteristics
  - b. 6 Virtues
- 3. His Skill with the Word of God
  - a. His Personal Devotion
  - b. His Pastoral Duty.

### **Questions:**

Warm Up:

1. What is one way that the sermon encouraged, exhorted, challenged, or corrected you?

Discussion:

- 1. Titus 1 shares that the Elder is to hold fast to the trustworthy word, what was the illustration pastor Scott used to describe this action and how does it help us understand how the elder is to interact with the Bible?
- 2. Read 2 Timothy 3:15-17. With God's Word being authoritative, how does this affect the way in which it directs our lives?
- 3. Why is the authority of Scripture a hard doctrine for people to swallow?
- 4. Read Ezra 7:10. How is he an example of how we should handle the word of God in our own lives?
- 5. Read Titus 2:1–6. What role does the Word play in discipleship in the body of Christ?
- 6. Read Romans 16:17-18, 2 Timothy 1:13-14, Acts 2:42. How is it that we can trust the Word is authoritative? Why is holding fast to the apostles teaching important?
- 7. Read Titus 1:9. What is the offensive strategy in the pastor's duty with the word? How does this offensive strategy grow and build the church?
- 8. Read 2 Timothy 4:2-3. How can losing sight of teaching sound doctrine hurt a church?
- 9. What are some reasons that pastors veer away from preaching sound doctrine?
- 10. How is the health of a church dependent upon the way in which an elder instructs in sound doctrine?
