Synopsis:

The quality of being above reproach is demonstrated in 3 areas of a man's life:

- 1. Home and Family life
- 2. His Personal Character
- 3. His Skill with the Word of God
 - a. His Personal Devotion
 - b. His Pastoral Duty.
 - c. His Pastoral Determination of the Word of God

4 Timeless Principles in responding to false teachers:

- 1. Recognize
- 2. Restrain
- 3. Rebuke
- 4. Reveal
 - a. In their Internal Corruption
 - b. In their external conduct

Discussion:

- 1. Read Matthew 15:11, 20. What is it that defiles a person? How then can one discern or recognize a false teacher?
- 2. Read John 18:28, how does this passage show the corruption and hypocrisy of the Pharisees?
- 3. If false teachers know the Bible and can teach the Bible, how are we to discern the difference between a true and false teacher?
- 4. How do we handle false teachers that are creeping into the church? Why?
- 5. What is the correlation between good works and a true teacher of the bible? Read Matthew 7:15-20.
- 6. False teachers deny God by their works. Scott said, "it is his walk & not his talk that reveals his person." What would be some examples of this?
- 7. False teachers are those who replace the true God with fake worship? In what ways are we prone to doing the same?
- 8. What is the importance of being equipped to recognise false teachers? What is at stake?
- 9. When you think of the role of an elder, what in Titus 1 has been clarifying for you?
- 10. Many people are more discerning when it comes to discerning the skill of a medical practitioner but far less discerning when it comes to discerning what preachers to listen to. Why is this?
