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## LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

After his resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples who were gathered together in a locked room and showed them the wounds he received in his hands and side from the crucifixion. John records in 20:20 that when the disciples saw the wounds they were "glad when they saw the Lord." They were glad because the wounds were proof that Jesus had indeed been resurrected and proof that he is the Christ.

But we also know from verse 24 that not all the disciples were together in that room that first Sunday. Thomas was noticeably absent for reasons John does not record. But Thomas' absence gave an opportunity to showcase the wisdom and compassion of God. The disciples who saw Jesus recounted their meeting with him to Thomas. At this point, Thomas had heard stories of the resurrected Jesus from Mary Magdalene (20:18) and his fellow disciples, yet he still did not believe. This puts us, those who have only heard of Jesus' resurrection and not seen him, in the same situation as Thomas. We might hear our own voice when Thomas said, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe." One week later, Jesus graciously gave these very opportunities to Thomas. But it seems that Thomas didn't have to touch Jesus; he, like the other disciples, believed when he saw him. In verses 30-31, John tells us that if we, like Thomas, want proof of Jesus' resurrection then we need look no further than the many signs (miracles) recorded in the gospel. When we approach these signs by faith, they are proof enough to satisfy that Jesus is truly the Christ, the Son of God.

- 1. Read John 11:16, 14:5, and 20:24-25. From what you learn about him in these verses, how would you describe Thomas? Why do you think he was so determined to disbelieve the report of the other disciples?
- 2. According to v. 25, what did the disciples do for Thomas? How can we apply this to believers who may have missed a worship service?
- 3. Read again Thomas' statement in v. 25. Then read v. 29. Did Thomas really have to touch Jesus in order to believe? What encouragement can we get from these verses when we hear someone demand a certain kind of "proof" about Jesus before they will believe?
- 4. Read verses 30-31. For what purpose did John record certain signs (miracles) that Jesus performed? How do the signs recorded in Scripture serve as proof that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God?
- 5. How are you encouraged and your faith strengthened by reading about the signs Jesus performed?
