Entering Into Worship Adoration, Praise, and Confession of Faith Worship in Prayer, Word, and Sacrament God's Blessing on His People

We are glad you are with us, and we invite you to join us after the service for a time of fellowship and refreshments.

PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP

In our justification by faith alone God imputes (or credits) the perfect law-keeping (or obedience) of Jesus to sinners and transfers the sinner's guilt and penalty for his violation of the law to Christ. There is no amount of effort on the part of sinful man—no amount of obedience—that can secure our justification. Hence, a person is justified by faith alone—we do not contribute our good works. This is why justification is by God's grace alone; God takes the initiative in salvation, not man. Moreover, this is why justification, and ultimately salvation, is by Christ alone. Jesus is the one who saves us. Our salvation is not a joint venture between us and Christ. Paul relentlessly hammers out these truths in his epistle to the Galatians.

All: We ask all this through the merit and mediation of our Savior, Jesus Christ, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at your right hand. All praise, honor, and glory be to you. Amen.

The Westminster Shorter Catechism

- Q. 30. How does the Spirit apply to us the redemption purchased by Christ?
- **A.** The Spirit applies to us the redemption purchased by Christ by working faith in us, and thereby uniting us to Christ in our effectual calling.
- **Q. 31.** What is effectual calling?
- A. Effectual calling is the work of God's Spirit, by which, convincing us of our sin and misery, enlightening our minds in the knowledge of Christ, and renewing our wills, he persuades and enables us to embrace Jesus Christ, freely offered to us in the gospel.
- Q. 32. What benefits are there in this life for those who are effectually called?
- **A.** Those who are effectually called partake in justification, adoption, sanctification, and the other benefits that, in this life, do either accompany them or flow from them.

GREETING FROM THE PASTOR

Today is the second Sunday of Advent. We will read Luke 1:57-80 and then sing the Song of Zechariah. Zechariah ends his song prophesying about the light that the Messiah will bring to our dark world. Philip Ryken, in his commentary on the Gospel of Luke, writes:

After darkness, light—this is what it means to be saved. Salvation is like the first glimmer of dawn after the blackest night. Until we come to faith in Jesus Christ, we are still living in the darkness of unforgiven sin. But when we trust him, as Zechariah did, his light comes into our lives and we are able to see our way. Believe in Jesus; the dark night of your sin will be over, and the dayspring of his light will rise in your heart.
