#### Confession of Faith

The Westminster Shorter Catechism

- Q. 85. What does God require of us, that we may escape his wrath and curse, due to us for sin?
- A. To escape the wrath and curse of God, due to us for sin, God requires of us faith in Jesus Christ, repentance to life, with the diligent use of all the outward means by which Christ communicates to us the benefits of redemption.
- **Q. 86.** What is faith in Jesus Christ?
- **A.** Faith in Jesus Christ is a saving grace, by which we receive and rest on him alone for salvation, as he is offered to us in the gospel.
- **Q. 87.** What is repentance to life?
- A. Repentance to life is a saving grace, by which a sinner, out of a true sense of his sin, and understanding of the mercy of God in Christ, does, with grief and hatred of his sin, turn from it to God, with full intention of, and endeavor after, new obedience.
