LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

As Jacob prepared to return home after spending 20 years in Laban's household, he feared what Esau would do to him. Before Jacob ran away to Laban's house, Esau had vowed to kill Jacob because Jacob had deceived their father and stolen Esau's blessing. We read in Genesis 27:41, "Now Esau hated Jacob because of the blessing with which his father had blessed him, and Esau said to himself, "The days of mourning for my father are approaching; then I will kill my brother Jacob."

In preparation for his encounter with Esau, Jacob made preparations to try to appease him by sending him gifts and displaying his wealth. But most importantly, Jacob prayed and asked the Lord for help. This is the most important thing that we can do when we fear others and when we fear the future—we must turn to the Lord in prayer. The promise we find in Scripture is that God is our heavenly Father who loves us in Jesus Christ, so that when we pray, we can be assured that he hears us and will answer us according to his will.

- 1. As you think about the first point in the sermon, what are the names and titles that you most often use in your prayers? What do those names and titles that you most often use reveal about God, and how do they help shape your prayers?
- 2. Do you use Scripture passages to help guide your prayers? What are the spiritual benefits of praying the Bible? Choose a short psalm or a passage of Scripture that is familiar to you and try to pray it.
- 3. What does it mean to humble yourself before God in prayer? How did Jacob do that, and how does Jesus' parable in Luke 18:9-14 reveal the difference between pride and humility?
- 4. What did Jacob ask for in his prayer (verse 11)? What does this reveal about Jacob's need and his confidence in God's strength?
- 5. In verse 12, Jacob quotes one of God's promises back to God as a way of emboldening himself in prayer. What promises of God can you think of from Scripture that you can use in your prayers to embolden you?
