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## LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

When historians record the history of nations and its leaders, they are often faced with the question of which details to include and which to leave out. Sometimes the details that cast the nation and its leaders in a negative light are left out. However, in describing the birth of the nation of Israel, Moses, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, included all the dark and sinful details to show us that God's promise was coming about by his grace and not by human effort. Iain Duguid in his book, Living in the Grip of Relentless Grace, writes:

It is important in the midst of this messy drama not to lose sight of what God is doing in all of this. Human sin and rivalry have been driving the action at one level, but at another level God has been accomplishing his purpose of making Jacob the father of a multitude of sons. What is more, at this point in God's plan the blessing will not pass to either Judah or Joseph. There was not one winner and eleven losers in the race for the Abrahamic blessing. Now the channel of God's blessing was broadening out, even as Isaac had declared in blessing Jacob (Gen. 28:3). God was making Jacob into a company of peoples, and even the sordid scheming of his wives would be the providential means by which God would accomplish his purpose of granting Jacob many sons. At the end of Jacob's life, he would not have to choose only one among his sons to bless, as his father had done; there would be blessings enough for all of Jacob's children to share (Gen. 48–49). Of course, many things might have been easier if Leah and Rachel had worked together harmoniously in pursuit of God's glory from the outset. Much pain might have been avoided. But God's plans were in no way thwarted by their stubborn, self-serving strategizing. On the contrary, it was through their sin that he achieved his good purposes.

- 1. Read Genesis 29:31 30:24 and make notes of each of the names given to the sons that were born. What does each name mean, and what does it reveal about that particular birth?
- 2. What does God teach us in these verses about the frustration and pain that results from us sinfully disregarding his design in creation? How is this particularly revealed in polygamy in this passage? How is it revealed in other ways in our society?
- 3. How does the striving within Jacob's family reveal his lack of spiritual leadership as a husband and father? What would have been a more godly way for Jacob to deal with the strife between Leah and Rachel? What is the danger of being passive as a father?
- 4. How does this passage reveal how God fulfills his covenant promises? Consider especially Deuteronomy 7:6-8 and Exodus 1:1-7. How does Genesis 30:1-24 point to Christ?
