LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

Consider King Hezekiah's prayer from 2 Kings 19 when he was facing the seemingly insurmountable Assyrian army:

O LORD, the God of Israel, enthroned above the cherubim, you are the God, you alone, of all the kingdoms of the earth; you have made heaven and earth. Incline your ear, O LORD, and hear; open your eyes, O LORD, and see; and hear the words of Sennacherib, which he has sent to mock the living God. Truly, O LORD, the kings of Assyria have laid waste the nations and their lands and have cast their gods into the fire, for they were not gods, but the work of men's hands, wood and stone. Therefore, they were destroyed. So now, O LORD our God, save us, please, from his hand, that all the kingdoms of the earth may know that you, O LORD, are God alone.

Psalm 46 is given to us for such troubles that we face in this life. Those times when the earth gives way, the waters roar and foam, and the mountains tremble and are moved into the heart of the sea. Hezekiah sought the counsel of the Lord on behalf of his people, who is our "refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." And the Lord delivered them, for "The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress."

- 1. As you reflect on your life, have you experienced times where it seems the earth gives way, the waters roar and foam, and the mountains tremble?
- 2. If so, what did you learn about God during these times? What did you learn about yourself?
- 3. If you haven't yet experienced such hardships, how can you now prepare for when they come?
- 4. Discuss the significance of verse 4: "There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High."
- 5. What does it mean to "Be still, and know that I am God"?
- 6. Discuss what we can do in times of trouble to sense God's presence.
