- **Q. 54.** What is required in the third commandment?
- Α. The third commandment requires the holy and reverent use of God's names, titles, attributes, ordinances, Word, and works.
- **Q. 55.** What is forbidden in the third commandment?
- The third commandment forbids all profaning or abusing of anything by which God makes Α. himself known.
- **Q. 56.** What is the reason attached to the third commandment?
- The reason attached to the third commandment is that, however those who break this Α. commandment may escape punishment from men, yet the Lord our God will not allow them to escape his righteous judgment.


