LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

The Apostle Peter wrote this second letter to Christians who were suffering under persecution and the despair that results from being led astray by false teachers. Peter wrote to remind them about the central truths of the gospel of grace and thereby to encourage them to persevere in their faith in Jesus Christ alone for justification, sanctification, and eternal life. While this letter was written to Christians nearly 2,000 years ago, it applies to all Christians throughout the ages who trust in Christ and who desire to grow in their faith in him. R.C. Sproul, in his commentary on 2 Peter, writes:

If you received a letter written to you personally from God, you would read it repeatedly until you knew every word and every subtle nuance in the text, because you were being informed by a knowledge that comes from God himself. I am firmly convinced that we have this very thing in sacred Scripture, which is why we never graduate from the school of Christ. We are always to be learning more deeply, more carefully, and more accurately the things that are written to us in the Word of God.

- 1. What do you know about Peter from the four gospels, the book of Acts, and the other New Testament books in which he is mentioned? How does Peter's growth in grace encourage you in your own walk with Christ?
- 2. Read Romans 6:20-23. What does it mean to be a slave of Satan, sin, and death? What does it mean to be a slave of Christ? How does being a slave of Christ actually produce true freedom?
- 3. Read Mark 3:13-19. Who were the apostles and what was their role in the early church? In what way are we also "sent out" by Christ into the world?
- 4. Read the following passages about Christ's divinity: John 1:1; 20:28; Titus 2:13; Romans 9:5; Hebrews 1:8; 1 John 5:20. How does knowing that Christ is both God and Savior encourage and embolden you in your faith?
- 5. Why did Jesus refer to his disciples as "friends" in John 15:15? What does this reveal about your relationship with him? How have you seen your relationship with him grow and mature over the years?
