LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

Last Sunday we learned that the Nicene Creed is a historical summary of the essentials of our Christian faith, and we noted especially the phrase about Christ's Second Coming: "he shall come again, with glory, to judge both the living and the dead." Another essential stated in the Creed is Christ's resurrection, which is summarized in the phrase: "he suffered and was buried; and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures..." The resurrection of Christ is the ground of our faith. Paul writes that if Christ has not been raised, then our faith is in vain. If Christ has not been raised, our faith is futile, and we are still in our sins (1 Corinthians 15:12-19). But the good news we read throughout the New Testament is that Christ has been raised, which means our faith is not in vain, and we are no longer in our sins. We can rejoice in knowing that "death is swallowed up in victory" as we give thanks to God, "who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:54-57). Philip Graham Ryken, in his commentary on Luke, writes:

According to the word of the gospel, Jesus is not among the dead, but among the living. He was crucified for the forgiveness of all our sins. His sacrifice has been accepted by God and now he has risen from the grave. Death is not the end for us, but by faith we have the free gift of eternal life. Now the resurrection body of the Lord Jesus Christ is at the right hand of God the Father in heaven, shining in glory and ruling the universe. One day soon he will raise us up to be with him forever, to the glory of God.

- 1. Read Luke 23:55 24:1. Why did the women bring spices and ointments to Jesus' tomb? What does this reveal about their devotion to Jesus? What does it reveal about what they expected to find in Jesus' tomb?
- 2. Read Luke 24:5. What is the irony in the angels' question?
- 3. What did the angels explain to the women to help them understand that Jesus was raised? Read the three passages in Luke in which Jesus clearly explains what will happen to him: Luke 9:21-22; 9:43-45; 18:31-34. Why did Jesus tell them in advance what would happen to him?
- 4. How does Jesus revealing to them in advance what would happen to him show his love for his chosen people? How does it reveal his obedience to the Father? How does this bring you assurance in your salvation? How does it increase your desire to glorify and praise Christ?
- 5. Read 1 Corinthians 15:20-23. What is meant by the word "firstfruits"? How does Paul connect our assurance of eternal life with Jesus' resurrection?
