SERMON NOTES

"Live in Light of Christ's Return" 2 Peter 3:10-18

1. Christ will return and renew his creation. (v. 10)

The time of his return is unpredictable. (1 Thess. 5:2; Matthew 24:42-44)

Westminster Confession of Faith 33.3: As Christ would have us to be absolutely convinced that there will be a day of judgment, both to deter all men from sin and to give greater consolation to the godly in their adversity, so will he have that day unknown to men, that they may shake off all carnal security, may always be watchful —because they do not know at what hour the Lord will come—and may always be prepared to say, "Come, Lord Jesus. Come quickly. Amen."


When he returns, he will renew (not destroy) his creation. (Romans 8:20-22)

LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

The Bible teaches that when Christ returns, he will renew his creation by purging away all sin and restoring all that was corrupted by sin. In the same way that our bodies will be raised to newness of life, creation will also be restored to its created glory so that we will enjoy it without corruption for eternity. Mark Jones, in his book *Living for God*, writes:

Like our bodies, which will be raised without losing our former identities, the new heavens and new earth will be recreated in terms of their former identity. God does not absolutely destroy and start brand-new with the world or us. He redeems both the world and us. The world and God's people anticipate the liberation of creation from its bondage to decay (Romans 8:18–25). So we are filled with hope because of what God has promised.

The language in Scripture suggests that we have much to look forward to as human beings, not just as isolated souls. In other words, the very joys and delights that we possess on earth are a mere taste of the eternal joys and delights we will experience in the new heaven and new earth. Whatever food we now enjoy will be like a grain of dust compared to the food we will enjoy in heaven. The best wine today will be like vinegar compared to the wine of heaven. Our bodies and souls will enjoy all that God's renewed creation can possibly offer.

Of course, we should not lose sight of the fact that we will do all things to the glory of God, but we should also not get caught up in thinking about heaven as a place where we escape the physical. Far from it: God redeems body and soul, so that both may function as they were intended in the paradise of God.

- 1. Read Isaiah 65:17-25. How does Isaiah describe the Messianic Kingdom? What images and analogies does he use to describe the peace, joy, and freedom we will enjoy?
- 2. Read 2 Peter 3:10. What does Peter say will happen when Christ returns? Review the cited readings from the sermon outline as you think about the significance of creation's renewal rather than its annihilation.
- Read 2 Peter 3:11-18 as you answer the following questions with your personal responses: How do you seek to live in holiness and godliness? Do you desire Christ's return? How are you hastening Christ's return through your witness?
- 4. Take a minute to skim all of 2 Peter. What do you recall from the sermon series that left an impression on you? What did you learn about our faith that challenged you? What did you learn that encouraged you?
