LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

In his commentary on Galatians, Martin Luther famously writes, "The highest of all God's commands is this, that we ever hold up before our eyes the image of his dear Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. He must daily be to our hearts the perfect mirror, in which we behold how much God loves us and how well, in his infinite goodness, as a faithful God, he has grandly cared for us in that he gave his dear Son for us. Do not let this mirror and throne of grace be torn away from before your eyes." In other words, Luther is simply encouraging us to preach the gospel to ourselves daily. As Christians, we are often prone to look to and rely upon our spiritual progress, self-righteousness, and good works to make us right before God. However, anything you and I do is not the good news of the gospel. The gospel is the good news concerning the person and work of Jesus Christ, as the book of Galatians and the whole of Scripture testifies.

As we read in Galatians 2:11-16, by disassociating with the Gentiles, Peter's conduct "was not in step with the truth of the gospel" (v. 14). Peter's actions did not line up with what he professed with his mouth—that Jews and Gentiles are now one in Christ and are saved by God's grace alone, through faith alone, and in Christ alone. And so, like us, Peter needed to be reminded again of the gospel. Although it must have been painful for Peter to hear it at that moment, thankfully, Paul was there to offer strong correction. Likewise, at times, you and I need to be corrected when our actions, attitudes, and words don't align with what we profess as Christians. However, correction proves that God loves us by not letting us wander away from the truth (Heb. 12:7-11).

- 1. What does Paul's rebuke of Peter demonstrate about the reliability and truthfulness of the gospel? Why was this important for the Galatians to understand? What do Peter's actions reveal about our continual need to be reminded of the gospel?
- 2. In verse 14, Paul states how Peter's conduct and that of the believing Jews was not in step with the truth of the gospel. What did Peter do that demonstrated he was not in step with the truth of the gospel? Is it wrong for New Testament believers to keep the ceremonial aspect of the law? (See WCF 19.3.)
- 3. In verse 12, Paul writes that Peter had compromised on the truth of the gospel because he feared the circumcision party. You and I live in a day when false teachers and unbelievers are maligning the gospel and the truth of the Christian faith. In what ways are you tempted not to stand up for the gospel but instead shrink back in fear, like Peter did?
- 4. In verse 15, what does Paul mean when he says to Peter, "We ourselves are Jews by birth and not Gentile sinners"? Is Paul saying that he and Peter are better than the Gentiles? Of what is Paul reminding Peter? (See verse 16.)
- 5. According to verse 16, Paul says no one will be justified by the works of the law, but by faith alone in Christ alone. Since this is the case, how would you reconcile verse 16 with what Paul says in Romans 2:13, "For it is not the hearers of the law who are righteous before God, but the doers of the law who will be justified"?
