LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

Exodus 5:19-23 records the discouragement Moses and the people of Israel felt after Pharaoh rejected God's command and made Israel's slavery even more miserable. Rather than experiencing the "victorious Christian life" that is described by some in the church today, Moses and Israel experienced what the Bible describes as the normal pattern of the Christian life: opposition and temptation. God was revealing his strength through their weakness and ultimately pointing them to his covenant faithfulness by which he sustains and saves his people. As Christians, our hope is not in our strength and faithfulness, but in God's strength and faithfulness. God has kept all the promises he made in the covenants revealed in Scripture, and he will fulfill all his promises that remain in the New Covenant with Christ. He sent Christ to atone for our sins, so we can be sure that he will sustain us until that day when he sends Christ again to consummate his Kingdom and make it on earth as it is in heaven.

- 1. For context, read Exodus 5:1-18. Why did Pharaoh respond as he did against God's command?
- 2. Review the three sources of opposition described in the first point of the sermon. What experiences have you had in your life with these sources of opposition? What things have you found helpful in your life that have helped you in your fight against the world, the flesh, and the Devil?
- 3. Why do you think Moses responded as he did in Exodus 5:22-23; 6:12, 30? What are things in your life that have made you feel like a failure? Read 2 Corinthians 12:1-10 and reflect on Paul's conclusion in verse 10. How does Paul's conclusion encourage you?
- 4. Read Exodus 6:1-8. What does God say about his past faithfulness and his future faithfulness? Review each "I will" in this passage and think about how each were fulfilled in redemptive history. What "I wills" do we have to look forward to in the New Covenant? How might reflecting on them strengthen your endurance in the Christian life?
