The Westminster Shorter Catechism

Confession of Faith

- **Q. 16.** Did all mankind fall in Adam's first transgression?
- **A.** The covenant being made with Adam, not only for himself, but for his descendants, all mankind, descending from him by ordinary generation, sinned in him, and fell with him, in his first transgression.
- **Q. 17.** Into what estate did the Fall bring mankind?
- **A.** The Fall brought mankind into an estate of sin and misery.
- Q. 18. What is the sinfulness of that estate into which man fell?
- **A.** The sinfulness of that estate into which man fell consists of: the guilt of Adam's first sin, the lack of original righteousness, and the corruption of his whole nature, which is commonly called original sin, together with all actual transgressions that proceed from it.


May the grace of Christ our Savior And the Father's boundless love, With the Holy Spirit's favor, Rest upon us from above.
