# **SERMON NOTES**

"Shaped for Heaven" 1 Thessalonians 2:17 - 3:5

The church is a family united in love. (2:17)

2.	Paul desired to be with the Thessalonians to help them grow in their faith. (2:19-20; 3:2)				
3.	God appoints affliction to shape us for heaven. (3:3-4)				

### LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

The pastoral heart of the Apostle Paul is clearly seen in 1 Thessalonians. In this epistle we can sense his longing to be with the Christians he was torn away from so suddenly when he had to leave Thessalonica. As we read in 2:17, though he could not be with them in person, he was with them "in heart"; his thoughts were with them because of his love for them and because of the afflictions they were suffering for their faith.

When troubles and afflictions come into our lives, our first thought is often that God has abandoned us because we mistakenly think that God is supposed to shield us from such hardships. Paul wanted to assure them that afflictions and persecutions are part of God's sanctifying work in His children. Paul reminds us in 3:3-4 that those who belong to Christ are going to suffer affliction. John Lillie, in his commentary on 1 Thessalonians, writes:

It is enough for us to know that such [affliction] is the will of God; that this fiery trial happens not without His knowledge, and consent, and purpose, and control; that He sits by the mouth of the furnace into which His people are cast; and that both the fervor and the duration of the process are regulated by His infinite, fatherly wisdom and love. Gladly, we may be sure, would He spare us...were it not for the necessities of the case, arising from the prevalence of sin and death in the world, and the presence of both in the Church itself.

Our persecutions and afflictions are not without purpose—they are means by which God weans us from this world, shapes us in Christian character, and equips us for serving and ministering to others who are struggling.

- 1. Read James 1:2-4. Why does James encourage us to count the trials we encounter with "all joy"? What does James tell us in v. 4 is the result of these trials?
- 2. In 1 Thessalonians 3:3-4 we learn that while he was with them, Paul taught the believers that they would be persecuted for their faith, that they were (as are we) appointed or destined to affliction in this life. If God appoints trials to us, then it is necessary (1 Peter 1:6) for our good. Read Matthew 5:10-12. What is the heavenly result of our persecution?
- 3. The results of our afflictions are not only heavenly, but we receive benefits in this life. Read Romans 5:3-5 and list the present benefits our suffering produces.
- 4. In light of these things, how should we look at the various afflictions and suffering we experience for our faith in Jesus? What are some ways you can look at your own suffering differently today?
- 5. How have the afflictions you have endured equipped you to minister to other believers? What are some practical ways you can apply your experience to encourage and support your brothers and sisters in Christ as they go through trials?
