Confession of Faith

The Westminster Shorter Catechism

- **Q. 53.** Which is the third commandment?
- **A.** The third commandment is "You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain."
- **Q. 54.** What is required in the third commandment?
- A. The third commandment requires the holy and reverent use of God's names, titles, attributes, ordinances, Word, and works.
- **Q. 55.** What is forbidden in the third commandment?
- **A.** The third commandment forbids all profaning or abusing of anything by which God makes himself known.
- **Q. 56.** What is the reason attached to the third commandment?
- **A.** The reason attached to the third commandment is that, however those who break this commandment may escape punishment from men, yet the Lord our God will not allow them to escape his righteous judgment.
