SERMON NOTES

"Equipped for a New Year" Hebrews 10:19-25

1. God has given us good gifts in Christ. (vv. 19-22)

2.	We are to exercise these gifts in service to God and the church. (vv. 23-25)			

LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

The gifts of God to his children are extravagant and numerous! Though we might be thankful to God for the many ways he provides for us each and every day, we often take them for granted and are not as appreciative as we ought to be. Because of our sin and rebellion, we deserve nothing, yet in his mercy he provides an abundance.

As we make plans for serving God in 2021, we are shown in Hebrews 10 that God has given us great gifts which enable us to serve him, live obediently, and minister to our neighbors.

- 1. Read Hebrews 10:19-25. Why can we enter into God's presence with confidence? How does the author of Hebrews use imagery from the temple to illustrate what God has done for us in Christ?
- 2. In vv. 19-21 the author of Hebrews makes factual statements about our current standing before God in Christ. Notice that he says "we have confidence" (v. 19), and "we have a great high priest" (v. 21). Since we have these things in Christ, what should our response be according to vv. 22-25? Are we able to do these things apart from Christ?
- 3. What are some practical ways you can draw near to God (v. 22), hold fast the confession of your hope (v. 23), stir up one another to good works (v. 24), and encourage one another (v. 25)?
