- **Q. 86.** What is faith in Jesus Christ?
- **A.** Faith in Jesus Christ is a saving grace, by which we receive and rest on him alone for salvation, as he is offered to us in the gospel.

LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

In Ephesians 4:11-12 the Apostle Paul says that Jesus gave good gifts to His church, and these gifts are "the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers" so that believers would be equipped for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ. Notice that these 'good gifts' have been specially called, raised up and equipped by God for the benefit of His body, the Church. They have a heart for God's people and a desire to serve them because they are precious in the sight of God. In 1 Thessalonians 2:1-12, we see that the Apostle Paul had a shepherd's heart for the Thessalonian believers. Even though his time with them was cut short, he served and ministered to them gently and affectionally, sharing their lives with them. In this we are given an example of what true shepherds (pastors) look like.

- 1. In 1 Thessalonians 2:1-12, how does Paul describe his (and Silvanus and Timothy's) ministry in Thessalonica? How does their ministry compare to popular 'televangelists' today?
- 2. Where does a pastor's authority and call to preach the gospel come from (v. 4)? In light of this, how should we receive the faithful preaching of the gospel (1 Thess. 2:13)?
- 3. What do we learn in these verses about the relationship between a pastor and a congregation?
