# **SERMON NOTES**

"Christ Is Our Perfect Great High Priest" Exodus 28:1 - 29:46; 30:22-38; 39:1-31

1. The clothing revealed that the high priest represented the people before God. (Exodus 28) The ephod (Exodus 28:12)  The breastpiece (Exodus 28:29)
Christ represents us before God in heaven. (Hebrews 9:24)
2. The ordination ceremony revealed that the priests were set apart for their office. (Exodus 29) The anointing with oil (Exodus 29:4-9)
Christ was anointed with the Holy Spirit beyond measure. (Isaiah 11:2; Luke 1:34-35)
3. The sacrifices during the ceremony revealed that the priests were not perfect. (Exodus 29) The sacrifices (Exodus 29:10, 15, 19)
Christ is our perfect Great High Priest. (Hebrews 7:26-27) He has perfected for all time those who are being sanctified. (Hebrews 10:14)
