LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS


During the Jewish and Roman trials of Jesus, one contrast that is consistently repeated is the sinfulness of his accusers and the guiltlessness of Christ. He is the Spotless Lamb who is betrayed into the hands of sinful men. The reason for this emphasis is to show by what means we receive pardon as sinners. We all stand guilty before God, deserving his just judgment and wrath. But Christ, the perfectly obedient Son, suffered in our place—the just for the unjust to bring us to God. Sinclair Ferguson writes:

Without knowing it, the religious leaders, Pilate, Herod, and Barabbas were all a part of a tapestry of grace which God was weaving for sinners. Jesus was not dying for his own crimes, but for the crimes of others; not for his own sins, but the sins of others. He did not die for himself; he died for us!

- 1. Review last week's sermon text from John 18:28-38. How did Jesus explain the difference between Pilate's kingdom (the kingdom of the world) and his Kingdom (the Kingdom of God)? How would you characterize the differences between these two kingdoms and how should the differences influence how you live?
- 2. Why do you think it is significant that Pontius Pilate is named in both the *Nicene Creed* and the *Apostles' Creed*?
- 3. How does Jesus' arrest and his trials before the Jewish and Roman leaders reveal humanity's depravity? What does the Apostle Paul teach about our depravity in Romans 3:9-20? Do you see evidence of this in your life and in the lives of others?
- 4. Why is it significant that in the sermon passage, Pilate said three times, "I find no guilt in him" when referring to Jesus? What do passages such as Hebrews 10:1-18 and Luke 4:16-21 reveal about Christ's sinlessness and his ability to save sinners? How might this strengthen your sense of assurance of salvation?
- 5. In preparation for next Sunday, read John 19:7-16. Why did the Jewish religious leaders want Jesus to be crucified? How did their sinful intentions reveal that what they meant for evil, God meant for the good of his elect?
