LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

The call to imitate is clearly taught in Scripture. In 1 Corinthians 11:1, Paul writes, "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ." But in Philippians, imitation is taught and caught. Paul calls believers to imitate him, other leaders (Timothy and Epaphroditus), and others in the church (3:17). He also implicitly warns us not to imitate the "enemies of the cross of Christ" (3:18). By setting up this contrast, he demonstrates how he and others are models of imitation that point to the Model—Jesus Christ. By paying close attention to Philippians 2-3, we not only hear the call to imitation and see the Model to imitate, but we also learn the Christian way to imitate.

- 1. Read 1 Cor. 4:16; 11:1; Eph. 5:1; Heb. 13:7; and 3 John 11. What do these passages teach us about Christian imitation? Why does the Lord call us to imitate Christ and others?
- 2. What are good and bad ways to imitate Christ? How would you encourage someone to imitate Christ if you know they struggle with moralism? Does imitating Christ look different when you understand the grace of God and our union with Christ?
- 3. Read Phil. 3:17-19. Why does Paul call believers to imitate him and not him *and* Christ? Who do you think are "those who walk"—leaders or leaders *and* other believers? Why are the "enemies of the cross of Christ" such bad models?
- 4. Read Phil. 2:5-11. How do you read this text? Does it describe what Christ has done for you as a *gift*, or does it also provide an *example* to live by? Does it matter?
- 5. Read Phil. 3:1-21. Do you see any parallels between this text and Phil. 2:5-11? Does it seem like the story of Christ is mapped onto Paul's life and ministry?
- 6. Read Phil. 2:19-30. Do you see any parallels between this text and Phil. 2:5-11? Does it seem like the story of Christ is mapped onto the lives and ministries of Timothy and Epaphroditus?
- 7. How does Philippians inform your understanding of Christian imitation?
