- A. The sacraments become effectual means of salvation, not from any virtue in them, or in him who administers them, but only by the blessing of Christ, and the working of his Spirit in those who by faith receive them.
- Q. 92. What is a sacrament?
- A. A sacrament is a holy ordinance instituted by Christ, in which, by perceptible signs, Christ and the benefits of the new covenant are represented, sealed, and applied to believers.
- **Q. 93.** Which are the sacraments of the New Testament?


LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS
