The Westminster Shorter Catechism

- **Q. 76.** Which is the ninth commandment?
- A. The ninth commandment is, "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor."
- **Q. 77.** What is required in the ninth commandment?
- A. The ninth commandment requires the maintaining and promoting of truth between man and man, and of our own and our neighbor's good name, especially in testifying as witnesses.
- Q. 78. What is forbidden in the ninth commandment?
- **A.** The ninth commandment forbids whatever is prejudicial to truth, or injurious to our own or our neighbor's good name.
