SERMON NOTES

"The Third Commandment: Worship Only the One True God in the Right Way and with the Right Attitude" Exodus 20:7

The Ten Commandments reveal:

God's holiness. Christ's obedience.

	Our need for Christ's righteousness imputed to us. How we are to live as redeemed and thankful followers of Christ.
1.	The Third Commandment requires the holy and reverent use of God's names, titles, attributes, ordinances, Word, and works. Exodus 3:14-15
	Every time we think of God, speak of God, or worship God, we need to do so with a holy and reverent attitude.
2.	The Third Commandment forbids all profaning or abusing of anything by which God makes himself known.
	It forbids using God's name heretically or blasphemously. (Daniel 5:1-4)
	It forbids using God's name thoughtlessly and insincerely. (Matthew 6:7)
	It forbids using God's name under false pretenses. (Acts 19:11-20)
3.	The Third Commandment points us to Christ.
	Christ perfectly revealed the Father through his words and works. (John 14:10)
	By his obedience, Christ received the name above all names. (Philippians 2:9-11)
	Through faith in Christ, we have received salvation in his name. (Romans 10:13)

LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

As we have learned so far in our study, the First Commandment teaches that we need to worship only the one true God. The Second Commandment adds an additional requirement that we need to worship only the one true God *in the right way*. The Third Commandment adds a further requirement: we need to worship only the one true God in the right way *and with the right attitude*. We must not approach God wrongly, casually, hypocritically, or insincerely. He is the Lord of the universe, our Creator and Redeemer. He is therefore worthy of our full attention and devotion. Michael Horton, in his book on the Ten Commandments, writes:

With much of popular preaching and evangelism conforming to the mentality of the bumper sticker that sports "God is my copilot," there ought to be little wonder why God's name is not hallowed in our society. For it is not hallowed in our churches. Our prophets and priests have falsely handled the Word, attributing more to human beings than to God. In Scripture, God is the potter and we are the clay. Salvation "does not ... depend on man's decision or effort, but on God's mercy.... Therefore, God has mercy on whom he wants to have mercy, and he hardens whom he wants to harden" (Romans 9:16–21). But in popular religion, God is there for me. I am the potter and He is the clay. After all, He can't do anything if I don't "let Him have His way." Only if I decide to let Him do this or that can He fulfill his will. After all, "Jesus is a gentleman who will not violate our free will," or so I was told growing up. The biblical God is clearly something other than this finite god of American religion. Taking God's name seriously depends on taking God Himself seriously, and that requires a God-centered theological perspective. (*The Law of Perfect Freedom*)

- For review, read Larger Catechism Q/As 103 and 110. Based on what you learned in each of the sermons on the First and Second Commandments, how do these commandments point to Christ?
- 2. Read Larger Catechism Q/A 112. How do you seek to keep this commandment in your life and worship? What are some of the changes you need to make in your life so that you can be more consistent in doing what this commandment requires?
- 3. Read Larger Catechism Q/A 113. As you consider what this commandment forbids, reflect on the 3 subpoints outlined in the sermon. Do you find that you have grown callous to seeing how this commandment is often broken by yourself and others? How might you re-sensitize yourself to the seriousness of all that this commandment forbids?
- 4. Review the way this commandment points to Christ. How does knowing his obedience to this commandment encourage you? How does it inspire you to approach God in worship and to serve God in the world?



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
