

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LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

While the disciples in the Upper Room were troubled and saddened by the news that Jesus was going to leave them, he gave them reasons to rejoice. He explained that he would soon return to the Father, where he would once again be exalted in glory (John 17:5). During his time on earth as the incarnate Son, Jesus underwent a time of humiliation because he was born of woman and born under the law. But after his suffering and death, he was raised and ascended in glory where he is now seated at the right hand of God. His exaltation was evidence to all things seen and unseen that he was victorious over Satan through his obedience to the Father and his death on the cross.

Like the disciples, we are often prone to feeling troubled and sad as we live in this fallen world. We tend to focus so much on our own day-to-day lives and the setbacks we experience in life that we lose focus of the grand truth that Christ is exalted in glory, ruling and reigning over all creation. Rather than letting the difficulties of this life trouble and sadden us, the Lord Jesus calls us to rejoice in the fact that he is now glorified with the Father as our victorious King. Take a few moments to consider how the current problems in your life that tend to make you feel troubled and sad would lose their grip on you if you consistently viewed them in light of Christ's sovereignty.

- 1. For review, read John 14 and note the ways Jesus comforts his disciples. What does he promise about the work of the Holy Spirit?
- 2. In John 14:28, Jesus says that the disciples should have rejoiced because he is going to the Father. Read the following questions and answers from the Westminster Larger Catechism. What benefits do Christians receive as a result of Christ's exalted glory?

Q. 43. *How does Christ execute the office of a prophet?* Christ executes the office of a prophet, in his revealing to the Church, in all ages, by his Spirit and Word, in divers ways of administration, the whole will of God, in all things concerning their edification and salvation.

Q. 44. *How does Christ execute the office of a priest?* Christ executes the office of a priest, in his once offering himself a sacrifice without spot to God, to be a reconciliation for the sins of the people; and in making continual intercession for them.

Q. 45. *How does Christ execute the office of a king?* Christ executes the office of a king, in calling out of the world a people to himself, and giving them officers, laws, and censures, by which he visibly governs them; in bestowing saving grace upon his elect, rewarding their obedience, and correcting them for their sins, preserving and supporting them under all their temptations and sufferings, restraining and overcoming all their enemies, and powerfully ordering all things for his own glory, and their good; and also in taking vengeance on the rest, who know not God, and obey not the gospel.

Q. 54. *How is Christ exalted in his sitting at the right hand of God?* Christ is exalted in his sitting at the right hand of God, in that as God-man he is advanced to the highest favor with God the Father, with all fullness of joy, glory, and power over all things in heaven and earth; and does gather and defend his Church, and subdue their enemies; furnishes his ministers and people with gifts and graces, and makes intercession for them.

3. Consider what we learned in the sermon about how Christ defeated Satan through the cross. How should this truth affect your daily life in the way that you fight against sin and temptation?
