LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

During his ministry, the Lord Jesus restored the sight of many blind people. This was a literal fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy of the Messianic Age, the promise that "the eyes of the blind shall be opened" (Isaiah 35:5). While extraordinary in and of themselves, these miracles all pointed to a greater reality. They revealed that Jesus, by his ministry, was bringing not just physical restoration but spiritual restoration to his people. When Jesus spoke to Nicodemus, the Pharisee who confronted Jesus at night in order to interrogate him, Jesus said to Nicodemus, "I tell you the truth, no one can see the Kingdom of God unless he is born again" (John 3:3). Those who do not have true faith are those who are spiritually blind, whose minds have been blinded by the god of this age so that they cannot see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ (2 Corinthians 4:4). To have true faith, then, is not a matter of being better or smarter than others, but it is a result of God's amazing grace that causes the lost to be found and the blind to see.

- 1. Before you begin thinking through the study questions about the sermon text, consider the baptism you saw today and the importance of improving or applying our baptism throughout our Christian lives. Consider for a moment Westminster Larger Catechism Q. 167 which asks: How is baptism to be improved by us? Answer: The needful but much neglected duty of improving our baptism is to be performed by us all our life long, especially in the time of temptation, and when we are present at the administration of it to others; by serious and thankful consideration of the nature of it, and of the ends for which Christ instituted it, the privileges and benefits conferred and sealed thereby, and our solemn vow made therein; by being humbled for our sinful defilement, our falling short of, and walking contrary to, the grace of baptism, and our engagements; by growing up to assurance of pardon of sin, and of all other blessings sealed to us in that sacrament; by drawing strength from the death and resurrection of Christ, into whom we are baptized, for the mortifying of sin, and quickening of grace; and by endeavoring to live by faith, to have our conversation in holiness and righteousness, as those that have therein given up their names to Christ; and to walk in brotherly love, as being baptized by the same Spirit into one body.
- 2. Read John 9:1-3. What were the disciples assuming by their question? What was wrong with their theology? What did Jesus explain as he corrected them?
- 3. Read Revelation 3:14-22. What was the spiritual problem of the church in Laodicea that Jesus identified? What did he say was the solution?
- 4. Read Acts 9:1-22. How does Saul's conversion illustrate sovereign grace?
- 5. What challenges did the healed man in John 9 face as a result of his faith in Christ? What does Jesus explain about the Christian life in Matthew 10:34-39?
- 6. In preparation for next week, read John 10:1-21. What does Jesus do that makes him the Good Shepherd?
