

LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

"What do you have that you did not receive?" (1 Corinthians 4:7). How would you answer that question? Think about your bank statement, the recent promotion, your marriage, children, grandchildren, your athletic abilities, your spiritual gifts, even your salvation. "What do you have that you did not receive?" I see only two possible answers:

You did not receive all that you possess - or - You did receive all that you possess.

The first response commits a heinous, theological crime: it confuses the Creator-creature distinction. God alone is the only being in the universe to possess without first receiving something. We, on the other hand, must receive something *extra nos* ("outside of ourselves") before possessing anything. After all, who can bestow on themselves the gift of life? The second response, then, is the most theologically accurate response a Christian could give: you *did* receive everything that you possess.

Nevertheless, it is one thing to affirm a theological truth in our heads and another to affirm it in our lives. My prayer is that, as we consider one of Paul's most God-glorifying doxologies (Romans 11:33-36), we would rightly understand our God, ourselves, and our possessions in light of God's gift of "all things."

- 1. Read 1 Cor. 4. What sinful struggles or thoughts dwell in the heart of a Christian who "boasts" about divinely given gifts (1 Cor. 4:7)?
- 2. Compare Rom. 11:34 and 1 Cor. 2:11-12, 16. If God's "judgments" and "ways" are "inscrutable" and "unsearchable," then what enables us to understand him? Will we ever fully understand God?
- 3. Compare 1 Cor. 8:6 and Col. 1:16. What differences and similarities do you detect? Note especially the specific prepositions (e.g., "from," "through," "for") and the person of the Trinity to whom they are applied. What is the significance of Paul applying "for" to God the Father in 1 Cor. 8:6, but he applies "for" to Christ in Col. 1:16?
- 4. Re-read Romans 11:33-36. What attributes of God are meant to humble believers, and what does Paul mean by the phrase "all things" (v. 36)? Should our theology (belief about God) always lead to doxology (worship of God)?
- 5. Read Romans 12:1-3. What are "the mercies of God," and how do they relate to our obedience: presenting ourselves as a living sacrifice (v. 1), not being conformed but transformed (v. 2), and not thinking too highly of ourselves?
- 6. Read Westminster Confession of Faith 2.2. Does God need you or me to be complete? If not, why does he save us at all?



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
